OBITUARY

His Excellency the Governor regrets to announce the death of Ix-Chief James Mutua, of the Machakos District, on 20th July 1951, after a prolonged illness.

James Mutua started his Government service in 1908 as a Police Clerk and Interpreter and from then until his retirement in 1944 he gave loyal and faithful service both to the Government and to the Akamba people amongst whom he had great influence and whom he was chosen to represent in London in 1931 before the Hilton Young Commission. He was a holder of a Certificate of Honour, and of the Jubilee and Coronation Medals.

By his death has been broken one more of the few remaining links with the early days of British Administration in East Africa.

SANSEVIERIA CUTTING RIGHTS VOI AREA

TENDERS are invited for the right to cut sansevieria on an area in the vicinity of Tsavo, bordered on the north by the Tsavo River and on the east by the railway line, comprising approximately 229 000 acres. A sketch plan of this area may be seen at the office of the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, the office of the Registrar of Titles, Mombasa, the office of the District Commissioner, Voi, and the Map Office of the Survey Department, Nairobi. Copies may be obtained from the Director of Surveys on payment of Sh 3 each.

Tenders should be in terms of the royalty which the tenderer would be willing to pay per ton of fibre and fibre tow produced. No offer of less than £10 per ton for fibre will be accepted, and the following conditions will apply—

(a) The concession will be for a term of two years and shall be terminable at one month's notice if the conditions laid down herein are not fulfilled to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands.

(b) A yearly premium will be payable in advance at the rate of ten cents an acre per annum.

(c) Government reserves the right to alienate the land during the term of the concession but any such alienation will be subject to the concession.

(d) The licensee may construct such roads and such factories as may be necessary for the working of the concession.

(e) The right to use a reasonable quantity of water sufficient for domestic and other ordinary purposes will be granted if such water is available but no guarantee can be given that the use of water for decorticating and fibre-washing purposes will be permitted. The right to use water for any purpose will be subject to the necessary permission having been obtained from the Water Board by the licensee.

(f) Royalty will be payable monthly on the basis of monthly statements supplied by the holders of the concession at the end of each month, these statements to be verified by a chartered accountant and submitted in such form as to show the tonnage of fibre and fibre tow produced.

(g) Apart from the cutting of sansevieria and the maintenance of firebreaks no other form of user shall be permitted.

(h) The licensee shall deposit Sh 2,000 on the signing of the licence which is returnable on the termination of the licence provided all the terms and conditions have been satisfactorily carried out.

(i) The tenderer shall supply full information of the amount of capital available for the operation of this concession.

(j) The successful tenderer will not be permitted to assign the whole or any part of the cutting rights.

(k) The concession shall be worked in a business-like manner to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands.

(l) The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.
