A BILL ENTITLED

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE REGULATION OF WAGES AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE, 1951

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Regulation of Wages and Conditions of Employment (Amendment) (No 2) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Regulation of Wages and Conditions of Employment Ordinance, 1951, hereinafter referred to as the principal 5 Ordinance

Amendment of section 4 of

the principal Ordinance

No 1 of 1951

- 2. Section 4 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—
 - (a) by inserting the word "thereafter" between the word "and" and the words "any such recommendation" 10 in sub-section (2) thereof, and
 - (b) by omitting the brackets and figure "(2)" which occur after the word "sub-sections" in sub-section (2) thereof

Amendment of section 7 of the principal Ordinance

3. Sub-section (5) of section 7 of the principal Ordin-15 ance is amended by substituting for the words "and shall come into operation" the words "and shall, subject to the terms of any resolution passed by the Legislative Council in relation thereto, come into operation"

Amendment of section 9 of the principal Ordinance

- 4. There shall be substituted for sub-section (2) of 20 section 9 of the principal Ordinance the following—
 - (2) A wages council shall, upon request by the Labour Commissioner, consider any matter affecting the industrial conditions of employees and employers in relation to whom it operates, and shall make a report 25 thereon to the Labour Commissioner, and a wages council may, if it thinks it expedient so to do, of its own motion make a recommendation on any such matter as aforesaid to the Labour Commissioner. On receipt of any such report or recommendation the Labour Commis-30 sioner shall make a report thereon to the Member who shall take it into consideration and take such action (if any) as he thinks fit

Amendment of section 10 of the principal Ordinance

- 5. Section 10 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Considerable difficulty has been experienced in operating the Regulation of Wages and Conditions of Employment Ordinance, 1951 (herein referred to as the principal Ordinance), owing to the requirements of section 10 (2) of the Ordinance that a period of thirty days must elapse between the first publication of a wages regulation proposal by the Wages Advisory Board and its implementation by a wages regulation order Maize meal forms a large item in the diet of workers at the minimum wage level, and an increase in the price of maize often necessitates a revision of the minimum wages. It is not possible to announce an increase in the price of maize meal in advance of the date on which it takes effect, for if this were done unscrupulous persons might withhold stocks from sale until the increase took place It is therefore impossible for the Board adequately to explain the reasons for a proposed increase in the minimum wage Moreover, the thirty days' notice now required makes it impossible rapidly to adjust the minimum wage to an increase in prices. In the original draft Bill, the provisions of section 10 began to operate only after the Board had submitted wage proposal to the Member, and the thirty days' notice referred to in section 1(1) (2) was not required The Select Committee on the Bill considered that any recommendation by the Board, including a recommendation as to minimum wages, should be subject to the whole of the procedu e laid down in section 10, and the Bill was passed with the amendrients recommended by the Select Committee to give effect to this Claises 2 and 5 (a) and (b) of this Bill will amend sections 4 and 10 cf the principal Ordinance so as to remove the need for the thir y days notification in respect of the fixing of a minimum wage by the Wages Advisory Board

- 2 The opportunity has also been taken to make the following other amendments to the Ordinance which are considered to be necessary. These are as follows
 - (a) Clause 3 will make it plain that a wages council order made by the Member and laid on the table of the Legislative Council under section 7 (5) will only come into force as made if no resolution by the Legislative Council relating to it is passed
 - (b) Clause 4 will make certain drafting an endments to sub-section (2) of section 9 of the principal Ordinance which do not affect the substance or meaning of the sub-section
 - (c) Paragraph (c) of clause 5 will amend sub-section (3) of section 10 of the principal Ordinance to make the Member responsible for publishing a wages regulation order made by him under section 10 (3) of the Ordinance instead of the Chairman of the Wages Advisory Board or of the wages council after being notified of its making by the Member
 - (d) Clause 6 will amend section 11 of the principal Ordinance to make it possible for the Member to impower a labour officer to authorize an employer to make specified deductions from the minimum wage of an employer in respect of rations supplied by the employer. This will give statutory recognition to what has under the Minimum Wage Ordinance (now repealed), been an established practice and was provided for in a proviso to the Order made under the Ordinance by the Governor in Council

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title and commencement Cap 75

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Asian Officers' Family Pensions (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Asian Officers' Family Pensions Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall be deemed to have come into operation 5 on the 1st January, 1946

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

- 2. Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—
 - (a) by substituting for the definition of "Asian officer" in sub-section (1) the following—

"Asian officer" means—

- (a) any male officer appointed to the service of the Government on terms ordinarily applicable to Asians, and
- (b) any other person who the Governor may, subject 15 to the provisions of section 12 of this Ordinance and subject also to such conditions as he may determine, admit to membership of the Fund.

"Karachi Agents" means the Agents in Pakistan for the Government of the Colony,

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will make certain amendments to the Asian Officers' Family Pensions Ordinance (Cap 75) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) which were rendered necessary as a result of the revised terms of service introduced with effect from the 1st January 1946 The following are the more important amendments which the Bill will make

The definition of "Asian officer" in section 2 of the principal Ordinance now refers to the Kenya Asian Local Civil Service As this service no longer exists the definition requires amendment in this respect. The definition also enables the Governor to approve for membership of the Fund any other officer. It is considered necessary that the Governor should also be able to specify conditions subject to which he approves any such other officer becoming a member of the Fund. Clause 2 (a) will redefine the definition of Asian officer to provide for these matters

Under the existing provisions of sub-section (4) of section 2 of the principal Ordinance if an officer, when he becomes a member of the Fund, is married to more than one wife, on the dissolution, whether by death, divorce or annulment, of his marriage to his wife by the earliest marriage (which is deemed to be the valid marriage for the purposes of the Ordinance) the first marriage after such dissolution is to be deemed the valid marriage. This has the effect of depriving the wife by the next marriage in point of time which subsisted coterminously with the one dissolved, of validity under the Ordinance. As this result was not intended clause 2 (c) of the Bill will amend the sub-section to provide that the next earliest subsisting marriage shall be the valid one

Contributors to the Asiatic Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Fund (which was superseded by the Asian Officers' Family Pensions Fund created by the principal Ordinance) were permitted to elect to transfer to the new Fund Subsequently by Secretariat Circular No 9 of 1946 persons who had so elected were told that they might revoke their options as it was considered that by reason of the terms of a previous circular on the subject some officers might have been misled into making an election to their disadvantage *Clause* 6 of the Bill will amend section 11 of the principal Ordinance to render legal the revocations made pursuant to Circular No 9 of 1946

Clause 7 will amend section 12 of the principal Ordinance so as to increase from £60 to £120 per annum the salary limit below which an officer is ineligible to become a member of the Fund and to exclude from membership learners and apprentices and officers serving on letters of temporary appointment on a month to month basis

Clause 8 (a) will amend section 14 of the principal Ordinance so as to provide that, in the case of an officer who retires on pension and continues to contribute at the rate at which he was contributing immediately prior to his retirement, Government's contribution will be based on the salary of the officer on which his contributions are based, rather than, as at present, on the officer's pension Clause 8 (b) amends the same section so as to provide that where an officer is specially approved for membership with retroactive effect, Government's contribution to the Fund shall not be retroactive unless the Governor otherwise directs

If the provisions of this Bill become law some additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred, but it is not possible to estimate with any exactitude what that expenditure is likely to be, except that the arrears of Government's contributions since the 1st January 1946, in respect of officers who will be permitted to transfer to the Fund from the Asiatic Widows' and Orphans' Pensions Fund will amount to approximately £44,000
