A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE HINDU
MARRIAGE, DIVORCE AND SUCCESSION
ORDINANCE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council there-
of, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Hindu Marriage,
Divorce and Succession (Amendment) Ordinance 1951, and
shall be read and construed as one with the Hindu Marriage,
Divorce and Succession Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 6 of the Hindu Marriage, Divorce and Succession Ordinance (Cap 149) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) applies the Subordinate Courts (Separation and Maintenance) Ordinance (Cap 6) to husbands and wives who, under section 3 of the principal Ordinance, are deemed to have contracted valid Hindu marriages. The aforesaid section 3 however only applies to Hindu marriages contracted in the Colony. Since it is believed that it was not the intention to exclude from the provisions of the Subordinate Courts (Separation and Maintenance) Ordinance (which provides for the making of separation and maintenance orders) persons who contracted a valid Hindu marriage outside the Colony, this Bill will amend section 6 of the principal Ordinance to provide for this.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.
