BRITAIN OFFERS INCREASED PRICES

HIGHER prices for uranium ores and concentrates—in some cases 100 per cent higher than previous prices—have been offered to prospectors in the colonies and dependent territories by the Ministry of Supply The offer does not apply in the United Kingdom

The reasons for the higher prices are—

- (a) the general increase in prices of metals since the Ministry's original offer in March, 1949, and
- (b) increased prices now offered by the United States and Canada

The new minimum prices for contained uranium oxide (delivered c.i.f. to a plant or United Kingdom port) range from 25s 0d per lb for ore containing not less than 0.2 per cent uranium oxide to 35s 0d per lb for ore containing not less than 10 per cent uranium oxide

These compare with the original minimum offer of 13s 9d per lb of uranium oxide delivered f o b ocean port

As an additional incentive, a development bonus equal to the purchase price will be paid for the first five tons of uranium oxide from previously unworked deposits, and capital may be provided for processing plants

The Ministry does not guarantee to buy less than one ton of uranium oxide, e.g. less than 10 tons of 10 per cent concentrate, or less than 500 tons of 0.2 per cent ore. The offer is also restricted to pitchblende ores and their secondary derivatives, no guarantee of purchase being made for refractory uranium ores that cannot be treated by simple acid-leaching plants.

The Ministry is also willing to discuss purchase terms for thorium-bearing minerals

Although Colonial Geological Surveys are, in general, much better equipped to provide assistance and analyse samples of radio-active ones than they were in 1949, the Geological Survey of Great Britain is continuing this service to prospectors

Inquiries on the subject will be dealt with by the Ministry of Supply Atomic Energy Division, Shell-Mex House, London, W C 2

The Atomic Energy Section of the Geological Survey of Great Britain is willing to assist local geological surveys or private prospectors in the indentification and radio-metric assay of iadioactive ones. 
