A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE MUNICIPALITIES ORDINANCE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title and commencement

Cap 136

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipalities (Amendment No 2) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Municipalities Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance), and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 20th day of February, 1951

Amendment of section 96 of the principal Ordinance

- 2. Section 96 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—
 - (a) by substituting for sub-section (6) thereof the following—
 - (6) There shall also be paid annually to the Council and the Board respectively—
 - (a) out of the Road Fund established under the Road Authority Ordinance, 1950, a grant of one-half of the cost of construction, reconstruction and 15 maintenance, to such standard as the Road Authority established under the Road Authority Ordinance, 1950, may approve, of such roads within the Municipality as the Governor in Council on the advice of the said Road 20 Authority may determine, subject to provision being made in the annual estimates of the Council or Board for the recovery of the remaining cost of construction or reconstruction and maintenance (or, where such remaining cost 25 is to be met from loan funds for the recovery of the interest and loan charges) out of rates
 - (b) out of the general revenue of the Colony—

imposed on the public,

- (1) such proportion as the Governor in Council 30 may direct of the revenue collected under the provisions of the Traffic Ordinance or any enactment amending or replacing the same in respect of vehicles belonging to persons having a residence or place of 35 business within the Municipality where such vehicles are ordinarily housed or kept,
- (11) a sum which is equivalent to one-third of the annual emoluments of the Town Clerk, the 40 Town Treasurer and the Town Engineer, respectively, appointed in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance,
- (111) a sum which is equivalent to one-half of the annual emoluments of the Medical Officer 45 of Health and of all qualified sanitary inspectors appointed in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance,

(iv) a sum which is equivalent to one-half of any expenditure incurred by the Council or Board, as the case may be, in connexion with outbreaks of infectious diseases, and such proportion, of any, of other expenditure in connexion with measures taken for the purpose of promoting and maintaining the public health as the Governor in Council may determine subject, however, to the approval by the Governor of the details of such expenditure,

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(b) by adding the following new sub-si ction—

(9) The Council or Board, as the case may be, shall cause a special account to be kept of expenditure incurred on the construction, reconstruction and maintenance of roads within the Municipality in respect of which a grant under paragraph (a) o sub-section (6) of this section has been made, and where any question arises as to the correctness or admissibility of any charge against such special account the decision of the Governor in Council shall be final

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MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Road Authority Ordinance 1950, amended sub-section (6) of section 96 of the Municipalities Ordinance (Cap 136) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) for the purpose of ensuring that after the establishment of the Road Fund he grant under paragraph (a) of sub-section (6) of section 96 of the principal Ordinance would in future be payable out of the Road Fund and not out of general revenue. The amendment however, went further than this and would result in certain other grants also being payable out of the Road Fund. This was clearly not the intention and the Bill will amend sub-section (6) of section 96 of the principal Ordinance accordingly. The opportunity has also been taken to make certain drafting changes in the sub-section.

No additional expenditure of public mone/s will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

It has been decided that, since the Road Authority is statutorily responsible for ferries by reason of the definition of "public road" in the Road Authority Ordinance 1950, the Road Authority should in future take over the functions in relation to ferries which are now exercisable by the Director of Public Works This Bill will amend the Ferries Ordinance (Cap 236) to provide for this

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Since under the Road Authority Ordinance, 1950, a public road is defined to have the meaning assigned to it in the Public Roads Ordinance (Cap 229) it includes ferries and thereby renders the Road Authority responsible for expenditure in connexion with ferries It is accordingly considered that licence fees payable under the Ferries Ordinance (Cap 236) should be redited to the Road Fund This Bill will provide for this

The opportunity has also been taken to amend sub-section (2) of section 13 to remove the obligation to publis 1 in the Gazette the estimates of the Authority As these estimates are required to be laid on the table of Legislative Council it is considered that sufficient publicity is thereby given and the requirement for publication in the Gazette involves a considerable additional expense which is not thought to be justified

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law


