**A BILL ENTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE MATRIMONIAL  
CAUSES ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Matrimonial Causes (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Matrimonial Causes Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance)

2. There shall be inserted next after section 4 of the principal Ordinance the following new section—

Extension of  
jurisdiction of  
the court in  
certain  
matrimonial  
causes

4A (1) Notwithstanding that the husband is not domiciled in the Colony, the court shall have jurisdiction in proceedings by a wife for divorce, if the wife is resident in the Colony and has been ordinarily resident there for 10 a period of three years immediately preceding the commencement of the proceedings

(2) Without prejudice to any jurisdiction exercisable by the court apart from this section, the foregoing provisions of this section shall apply to proceedings for nullity 15 of marriage as they apply to proceedings for divorce

(3) In proceedings under sub-section (1) of section 21 of this Ordinance the court shall have jurisdiction in the following cases only, that is to say—

(a) in any proceedings, if the petitioner is domiciled 20 in the Colony,

(b) in proceedings by the wife, if she is resident in the Colony and has been ordinarily resident there for a period of three years immediately preceding the commencement of the proceed- 25 ings,

and in determining for the purposes of this sub-section whether a woman is domiciled in the Colony, her husband shall be treated as having died immediately after the last occasion on which she knew or had reason to 30 believe him to be living

Cap 146

(4) In any proceedings in which the court has jurisdiction by virtue of this section or of the proviso to section 4 of this Ordinance or of section 3 of the Matrimonial Causes (War Marriages) Ordinance, the issues 35 shall be determined in accordance with the law which would be applicable thereto if both parties were domiciled in the Colony at the time of the proceedings

Amendment of

3. There shall be substituted for sub-section (2) of section 13 the following new sub-section— 40

(2) Where a decree of nullity is granted in respect of a voidable marriage, any child who would have been the legitimate child of the parties to the marriage if it had been dissolved, instead of being annulled, on the date of the decree shall be deemed to be their legitimate 45 child notwithstanding the annulment

4. There shall be inserted next after section 24 of the principal Ordinance the following new section—

Insertion of section 24A in the principal Ordinance

5           24A (1) Where a husband has been guilty of wilful neglect to provide reasonable main enance for his wife or the infant children of the marriage, the court, if it would have jurisdiction to entertain proceedings by the wife for judicial separation, may, on the application of the wife, order the husband to make to her such periodical payments as may be just and the order may be enforced in the same manner as an order for alimony in proceedings for judicial separation

Additional power of court to make order for maintenance

15           (2) Where the court makes an order under this section for periodical payments it may, if it thinks fit, order that the husband shall, to the satisfaction of the court, secure to the wife the periodical payments, and for that purpose may direct that a proper deed or instrument to be executed by all necessary parties shall be settled and approved by the court

20           5. There shall be inserted next after section 34 of the principal Ordinance the following new section—

Insertion of section 34A in the principal Ordinance

34A (1) Notwithstanding any rule of law, the evidence of a husband or wife shall be admissible in any proceedings to prove that marital intercourse did or did not take place between them during any period

Evidence of access

25           (2) Notwithstanding anything in this section or any rule of law, a husband or wife shall not be compellable in any proceedings to give evidence of the matters aforesaid

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will amend the Matrimonial Causes Ordinance (Cap 145) (herein referred to as the principal Ordinance) so as to bring the local law relating to divorce into line with the law in the United Kingdom as it is since the changes made by the Law Reform (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1949

*Clause 2* of the Bill will extend the jurisdiction of the court so as to enable it to entertain proceedings by a wife notwithstanding that the husband is not domiciled in the Colony if the wife is resident in the Colony and has been ordinarily resident here for three years immediately preceding the proceedings

*Clause 3* will amend section 13 so as to provide that where a marriage is annulled any child who would have been a legitimate child of the marriage if the marriage had been dissolved instead of being annulled shall be deemed to be a legitimate child

*Clause 4* will insert a new provision which will enable the court to make an order for maintenance where a husband has been guilty of wilful neglect to provide maintenance for his wife or any infant child in any case in which it would have jurisdiction to entertain proceedings by the wife for judicial separation

*Clause 5* will insert a new provision the effect of which will enable, but not compel, either the husband or the wife to give evidence tending to prove that marital intercourse did or did not take place between them during any period. This amendment will override the decision in the leading case of *Russel v Russel* in which it was decided that neither party to the marriage could give evidence tending to bastardize any issue of the marriage

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

AN ORDINANCE TO APPLY CERTAIN SUMS OF  
MONEY FOR THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR END-  
ING THE 31st DAY OF DECEMBER, 1952**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

- Short title
1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation Ordinance, 1951
- Public revenue and other funds charged
2. The public revenues for the year 1952 and other funds of the Colony are hereby charged towards the service of the year ending the 31st day of December, 1952, with the sum of sixteen million, four hundred and fifty-two thousand six hundred and fifty-nine pounds in respect of the Colony, and with a further sum of six million, two hundred and eighty-eight thousand and thirty-one pounds in respect of the Development and Reconstruction Fund
- Application of moneys granted
- 3 The moneys granted by this Ordinance shall be applied for the purposes and services specified in the First and Second Schedules to this Ordinance
- Accountant General's authority for payment
4. The Accountant General of the Colony is hereby authorized and required from time to time upon the warrant or order of the Governor to pay out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony for the several services specified in the First and Second Schedules to this Ordinance the said sum of sixteen million, four hundred and fifty-two thousand six hundred and fifty-nine pounds and the said further sum of six million, two hundred and eighty-eight thousand and thirty-one pounds which will come in course of payment during the year ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two

OF AN EXPORT DUTY ON CERTAIN COM-  
MODITIES

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya,  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof, as follows —

Short title and  
commencement

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Export Duty Ordinance, 1951, and shall, except as otherwise provided in section 9 of this Ordinance, come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1952

2. There shall be raised, levied, collected and paid 5  
upon the exportation of any of the commodities specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Ordinance an export duty at the rate specified in the second column of the said Schedule opposite each such commodity

Time of  
exportation

3. For the purposes of this Ordinance and notwith- 10  
standing the provisions of section 136 of the Customs Management Ordinance, the time of exportation of any commodity specified in the Schedule to this Ordinance shall be deemed to be the actual time at which the aircraft, vessel or vehicle on which such commodity is exported departs from 15  
its final position, anchorage or berth within the Colony

Power to  
amend the  
Schedule

4. (1) The Governor in Council may by order increase or decrease the rate of duty payable on any commodity speci-  
fied in the Schedule to this Ordinance or may abolish the duty thereon 20

(2) Every order made under this section shall be laid on the table of the Legislative Council as soon as possible, and not later than the next sitting of the Council, after the date upon which it came into operation, and if not approved by a resolution of the Legislative Council passed within seven days 25  
after it has been so laid shall thereupon cease to have effect but, subject to the provisions of sub-section (3) of this section, the non-approval of the order shall not affect anything done or suffered under the order between the date on which it came into operation and the date on which it ceased to have effect 30

(3) Where in compliance with the provisions of any order under this section which is not subsequently approved by the Legislative Council any person has paid export duty at an increased rate on any commodity subject to export duty on the coming into operation of such order, the Accountant 35  
General on the warrant of the Governor, shall make an appropriate refund to such person, and where in compliance with any such order as aforesaid any person has paid no export duty or has paid export duty at a reduced rate on any commodity subject to export duty at the date of the coming

into operation of such order, such person shall be liable to pay export duty at the rate in force prior to the coming into operation of the order or, as the case may be, to make good the deficiency of export duty by paying in respect of such commodity an amount equal to the difference between the amount of export duty which he would have been liable to pay had such order not come into operation and the amount of export duty already paid by him

5. (1) For the purposes of this Ordinance the average f o b value at the time of exportation of the commodities specified in the Schedule to this Ordinance shall be determined by the Member for Finance in the manner prescribed in sub-section (2) of this section

Calculation of  
average f o b  
value

(2) On the 1st day of January, 1952, and thereafter at the end of every period of one month the Member for Finance shall calculate the average price of each of the commodities mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance. Such average price shall be calculated on the prices obtaining during the last period of thirty days in respect of which figures are available preceding the first day of the month for which the average price will be applicable

Provided that—

- (i) in the case of sisal fibre the average price in respect of each grade of sisal fibre shall be separately calculated,
- (ii) in the case of hides and skins the average price to be calculated on the 1st day of January, 1952, shall be the average price during the preceding three months and thereafter the average price shall be calculated from time to time at the discretion of the Member for Finance on the price prevailing over a period of three months ending one month prior to the date upon which such new average price will become effective

6. The Governor may in his discretion authorize a refund of the export duty or any part thereof in any case where, in his opinion, the payment of the tax has caused hardship

Refunds

7. The Governor in Council may make rules—
- (a) regulating the collection and payment of export duty imposed under this Ordinance,
  - (b) authorizing a refund of export duty in cases where a similar duty or tax has been paid on the same commodity under the law of the Uganda Protectorate or the Trust Territory of Tanganyika,
  - (c) authorizing the exemption from export duty of commodities which are exported for consumption in the Uganda Protectorate or the Trust Territory of Tanganyika

Rules

8. (1) This Ordinance shall continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1952 and shall then expire

Duration of

Provided that the Governor may by proclamation, with the approval of the Legislative Council signified by resolution, declare that this Ordinance shall continue in operation until a date to be fixed in such proclamation

(2) Upon the expiry of this Ordinance the provisions of sub-section (3) of section 13 of the Interpretation and General Clauses Ordinance shall apply as if this Ordinance had been repealed

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will impose export duties on certain commodities in order to provide funds to meet a portion of the deficit disclosed between the cost of the Colony's approved Development Plan and the funds which are estimated to be available to finance that Plan

Clause 2 provides for the imposition of the duty

Clause 3 defines for the purposes of the Ordinance the time at which a commodity is deemed to be exported

Clause 4 gives the Governor in Council power by order to increase or decrease the rate of duty or to abolish any duty specified in the Schedule in relation to any commodity The clause requires any such order to be laid on the table of the Legislative Council and provides that if it is not approved by resolution passed within seven days it shall cease to have effect without prejudice to anything done under the order prior to that date Sub-clause (3) makes provision for refunding to a person duty which he has overpaid as a result of any order which is not subsequently approved This sub-clause also provides for the payment by a person of any duty which he has not paid pursuant to an order which is subsequently not approved

Clause 5 prescribes how the average f o b value on which the duty imposed on the commodities mentioned in the Schedule is based is to be calculated and contains a proviso requiring in the case of sisal fibre that the value shall be separately calculated for each grade and that in respect of hides and skins the value shall be calculated on a three-monthly rather than on a monthly period

Clause 6 empowers the Governor to authorize refund of any duty where in his opinion the tax has caused hardship

Clause 7 empowers the Governor to make rules for certain specified purposes

Clause 8 provides that the Ordinance shall continue in force until the 31st of December, 1952, subject to a proviso that it may be extended by proclamation made with the approval of the Legislative Council

Clause 9 makes special provision as to the date of the commencement of the Ordinance in relation to hides and skins This is necessary because notice of any change in the cess under the Hide and Skin Trade Ordinance has to be given

Clause 10 exempts from the duty any of the commodities mentioned in the Schedule which, though exported from the Colony, originated in Uganda or Tanganyika

The Schedule specifies in the first column the commodities on which duty is payable and in the second column the rate of duty payable thereon

It is not possible to estimate what, if any, additional expenditure of public money will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Officers (Change of Titles) Ordinance, 1951
- Substitution of new title of public officer

2. Whenever the title of a public officer set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Ordinance appears in any Act or Ordinance or in any proclamation, rule, regulation, by-law, order, notification, notice or other instrument, it shall be deemed to be replaced by the title set out opposite thereto in the second column of the said Schedule
- Provision for future change of titles of public officers

3. Whenever any change of title of any public officer occurs after the date of the commencement of this Ordinance, the Governor may, by notice in the Gazette amend the the Schedule to this Ordinance either by addition or by substitution and upon publication of any such notice whenever any title set out in the first column of the Schedule as so amended occurs either substantially or by implication in any Ordinance or enactment or in any proclamation, rule, regulation, by-law, order, notification, notice or other instrument such title shall be deemed to be replaced by the title set out opposite thereto in the second column of the said Schedule

## MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

It has been brought to notice that the provisions of the Public Officers (Change of Titles) Ordinance (Cap 60) may be open to the interpretation that the only titles which may legally be changed by the Governor under section 3 of that Ordinance are titles which appeared in any Ordinance, rule regulation, order or notice in force at the date of the commencement of the Ordinance. Since it is clear that this was never intended it is considered desirable to replace the Ordinance with one which will unequivocally enable change of titles to be effected by the Governor by notice in the Gazette, whether such titles now exist or hereafter come into existence.

This Bill will so provide and will repeal the Ordinance referred to above.

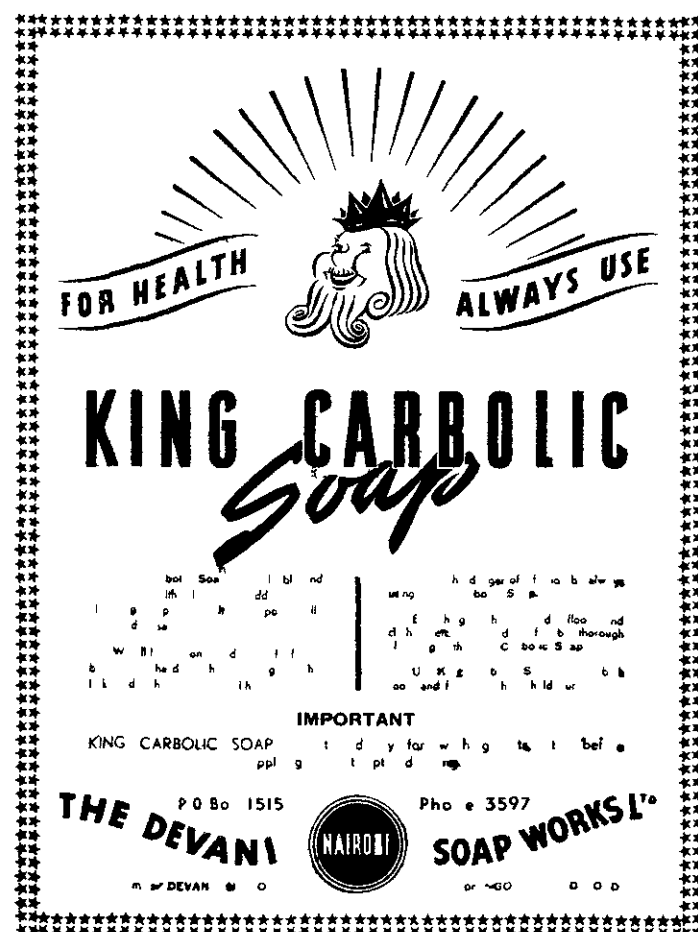

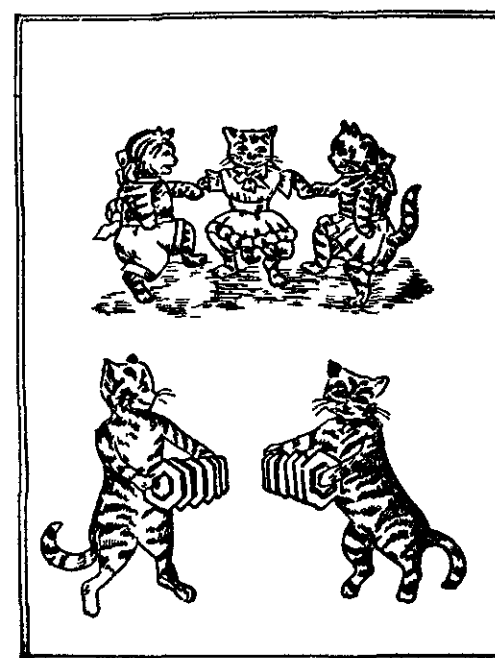

2 The school is situated on the Government Farm at Morogoro in the Eastern Province of Tanganyika Territory and will accommodate 10 pupils from Kenya and 20 from Tanganyika.

3 Applications from residents of Kenya for admission should be submitted to the Secretary of the Indian and Arab Settlement Board, c/o The Secretariat, Nairobi.

4 Applications will be considered in the first instance by the Indian and Arab Settlement Board who will make their

recommendations to the Director of Agriculture whose decision in regard to the admission of candidates shall be final.

5 Candidates must have completed Form III in a Kenya secondary school.

An authentic certificate of education must accompany the application form.

The candidate must be of good physique and must be prepared to undertake hard manual work as part of his practical training.

A medical certificate of fitness, signed by a registered medical officer must accompany the application for admission.

6 The period of training is of two years duration commencing early next January, 1952, it will be divided into six terms with two vacations. Any students who fail to reach the requisite standard of classroom or practical work at the end of each term may be required to leave the school.

The detailed course of study is given below. It has been designed so as to cover all the subjects, an elementary knowledge of which is necessary for a successful practical farmer.

7 Students must comply with all school rules and regulations laid down by the headmaster and must accept the authority of the school staff.

8 An up-to-date record for each student will be maintained and this will be taken as a guide for the issue of certificates on the completion of the course.

9 At the end of each intermediate term there will be class examinations covering both theoretical and practical work and at the end of the full course an examination will be set on which, together with the previous class record, the reward of a Certificate of Agriculture will be based and a Certificate will be issued to successful candidates.

10 A fee of Sh 110 per month (excluding vacation periods) will be payable before the commencement of each term to cover the following school charges —
