**A BILL ENTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE TRADING IN  
UNWROUGHT PRECIOUS METALS ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Trading in Unwrought Precious Metals (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951, and shall be read and construed as one with the Trading in Unwrought Precious Metals Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Rewards

2. There shall be inserted next after section 20 of the principal Ordinance the following new section—

21 (1) Any person, other than a person in the service of the Government or of the High Commission, who gives to the police any information leading to any 10 other person being prosecuted to conviction for an offence against this Ordinance may, at the discretion and upon the written authority of the Commissioner of Police, be paid out of the general revenue of the Colony a monetary reward of such amount, not exceeding one- 15 third of the proceeds derived from the sale of any unwrought precious metal which the court convicting such person may have declared to be forfeited to His Majesty under section 17 of this Ordinance

(2) Nothing in this section shall confer on any 20 person any right in law to a monetary reward

**MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS**

It is believed that a considerable amount of illicit trading in unwrought precious metals takes place in the Colony but the Police have so far had little success in uncovering it. It is accordingly considered that a provision in law enabling the Commissioner of Police to authorize the payment of a reward to persons who give information leading to successful prosecutions will, as indeed a similar provision has done in Tanganyika, materially assist the Police in detecting and securing the punishment of offenders. This Bill will amend the Trading in Unwrought Precious Metals Ordinance (Cap 172) to provide for this

**A BILL ENTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE DIAMOND  
INDUSTRY PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1949**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Diamond Industry Protection (Amendment) Ordinance, 1951 and shall be read and construed as one with the Diamond Industry Protection Ordinance, 1949, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Short title

No 5 of 1949

2. There shall be substituted for the word and figures “section 24” which occur in the definition of “diamond protection area” in section 2 of the principal Ordinance the word and figures “section 25”

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

3. There shall be inserted next after section 22 of the principal Ordinance the following new section—

Insertion of new section 22A in the principal Ordinance

22A (1) Any person, other than a person in the service of the Government or of the High Commission, who gives to the police any information leading to any other person being prosecuted to conviction for an offence against this Ordinance may, at the discretion and upon the written authority of the Commissioner of Police, be paid out of the general revenue of the Colony a monetary reward of such amount not exceeding one-third of the proceeds derived from the sale of any diamond which the court convicting such person may have declared to be forfeited to His Majesty under subsection (2) of section 16 of this Ordinance

Rewards

(2) Nothing in this section shall confer on any person any right in law to a monetary reward

**MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS**

It is believed that a considerable amount of illicit trading in diamonds takes place in the Colony but the Police have so far had little success in uncovering it. It is accordingly considered that a provision in law enabling the Commissioner of Police to authorize the payment of a reward to persons who give information leading to successful prosecutions will, as indeed a similar provision has done in Tanganyika, materially assist the Police in detecting and securing the punishment of offenders. This Bill will amend the Diamond Industry Protection Ordinance, 1949 to provide for this.

The opportunity has been taken to correct a wrong sectional reference in section 2 of the principal Ordinance.

It is not possible to estimate what additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law but any expenditure will be more than offset by revenue.

TWO timber concessions will be available for exploitation in the South Mengo Region of Buganda after 1st July, 1952, and exploitation and milling must commence not later than 31st December, 1952

One concession will be in the Mabira Forest commencing in the western portion of the forest. The other will cover the remaining forests of South Mengo, commencing in those forests which lie between miles 18 and 24 on the Kampala-Mubende road.

In each concession it will be compulsory to fell certain species of trees. These species with one exception are at present compulsory in the existing concessions of South Mengo and comprise those for which markets are already well established. The maximum cut of compulsory species in any one year will be 210,000 hoppus feet of logs in each concession, but it will be possible for the miller to increase his output by developing other species which are not compulsory. Moreover any compulsory species greater than 14 ft 6 in girth will be regarded as additional to the figure stated.

The minimum annual permissible cut of compulsory species (under 14 ft 6 in girth) will be 170,000 hoppus feet of logs in each concession.

The basis of tenders shall be the forest fees offered in cents per cubic foot (hoppus measure, Forest Department tables). Tenders of less than Sh 1 per hoppus foot for mvule, 75 cents for other Class I timbers, 60 cents for Class II timbers and 50 cents for Class III timbers will not be considered. The classes of timber are defined in Part B of the First Schedule to the Forest Rules as amended. If at any time during the currency of the licence the forest fees as gazetted in the Forest Rules are increased, those of the licensee will be increased by the same amounts. Cess shall be paid at the rates of 25 cents per hoppus foot round timber on mvule and other first-class timbers, 15 cents per hoppus foot on second-class timbers and 10 cents per hoppus foot on third-class timbers. These rates are subject to any alterations in the gazetted rates of cess.

Each miller will be required to lodge a deposit of £500 with the Conservator of Forests on receipt of his licence. This sum will be a guarantee of fulfilment of the conditions of the licence and will be returnable on the expiry of the licence but not if the licence is cancelled through any default on the part of the miller.

Two years from the granting of the licence will be allowed for millers to develop the concession to the minimum intake of 170,000 hoppus feet of compulsory species a year and during that time forest fees and cess will be payable on the timber actually cut and removed. From the commencement of the third year, however, a minimum annual royalty and cess will be payable and forest fees and cess due in excess of this minimum will be paid on submission of accounts by the Forest Department. Initially the minimum annual royalty and cess will be £6,600, subject to any revision of forest fees and cess during the currency of the licence.

Within six months of the issue of licences millers will be required to submit to the Conservator of Forests for approval a complete plan of forest operations showing main cutting areas and extraction roads covering the first five years of the licence.

Each concession will be granted for a period of ten years in the first place with the option of renewal for two further consecutive periods of ten years at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

Applicants must submit with their applications a plan or plans of the sawmill which it is proposed to erect, showing the layout of the mill and the type and capacity of the machinery and equipment to be installed. This must include provision for dipping of susceptible timbers and stacking sheds for seasoning. Applicants must state what transport equipment they propose to use.

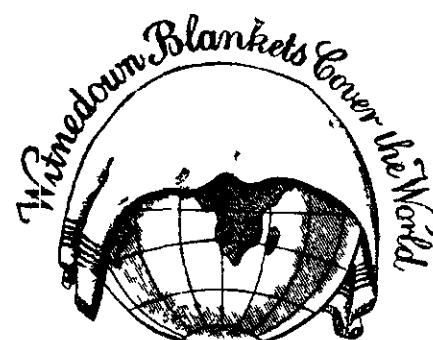
