WHEREAS by section 23 of the African District Councils Ordinance, 1950, the Member for Education, Health and Local Government is empowered to authorize an African District Council to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes speci-fied therein, and for any other purpose which the Governor may consider to be necessary or desirable in the interests or for the well-being of the inhabitants:




