PENSIONS FUND CONTRIBUTION

5 It was pointed out in paragraph 4 of the Audit Report for 1949 that the correct percentage of salary to be applied for the purpose of calculating pension contribution is 22%, as recommended by the Secretary of State in his telegram (3) of 3rd January, 1948. The contribution was again calculated at 22½%, thus causing the excess charge referred to in the previous paragraph.

SERVICES RENDERED AT POST OFFICES

6 The marked increase in the cost of this service has been referred to by the Postmaster General at paragraph 7 of his Report. The rate of 7 cents per transaction was known to be unremunerative but the question of discontinuing this indirect subsidy to the Savings Bank did not arise until the East African Posts and Telegraphs Department became self-financing. Assessment of the actual cost of this service revealed that the cost per transaction in 1950 was 53 52 cents.

The overdebit on this item referred to in paragraph 4 above was caused by calculating the pension contribution at 22½% instead of 22%.

CASH POSITION

7 Interest due to the Kenya Treasury as the result of an excess of expenditure over revenue during December 1950, was incorrectly calculated resulting in overdebit to the Savings Bank of £36-18-30. For a period of five months at the beginning of the year there was an under investment of available funds, the excess of revenue not invested at the end of May being approximately £183 000. When the attention of the Chief Accountant was drawn to these facts he agreed that under investment had occurred.

INTEREST ON INVESTMENTS

8 (a) An amount of £50-10-08 was incorrectly credited to this account in October 1950.

(b) Credit in respect of interest on deposits in the Joint Colonial Fund for the period 1st January, 1949-30th September, 1949, amounting to £900-4-00 is also included in this account. Owing to the late presentation of Kenya Treasury Accounts through which the credit appeared it was not possible to include the amount in the 1949 account. An amount of £18-18-50 representing interest on similar deposits for the final quarter of 1949 will be included in the 1951 accounts.

ADDITIONAL CHARGES

10 (a) *Brokerage on Purchases and Sales of Investments*—In previous accounts these charges have been included in the cost of the stock purchased or sold. The net effect of charging this item to expenditure is that the credit balance on the Income and Expenditure Account carried to the Reserve Account is decreased and the credit balance on the Investments Adjustment Account is increased.

(b) *Electric Light Account*—Expenditure in respect of electric light is now being charged against Savings Bank funds as the result of an audit query.

SAVINGS BANK SECURITIES—APPENDIX IX

11 In this statement there has now been inserted a new column, "Actual Cost of Stock". This shows the actual cost of stock purchased since 31st December, 1930, or the middle market value at that date of all stock purchased previously.

FRAUDS

12 At Nairobi an account with a deposit of Sh 332 was opened in error in the name of an ex-Askari, over a period the latter drew on the account, with the result that eventually a loss of Sh 328/71 was sustained. The ex-Askari could not be traced, and the loss was written off under the authority of the Member for Finance.

13 A Withdrawal Warrant for Sh 219/62 was paid at Kitui to a person other than the depositor. The payee could not be traced and the amount was written off on the Authority of the Member for Finance.

BALANCING OF DEPOSITOR'S ACCOUNTS WITH THE GENERAL LEDGER

14 The position with regard to the balancing of the Depositor's Accounts with the General Ledger for 1949 remains the same as was indicated in the Audit Report for 1949. The balancing of the accounts with the ledger for 1950 has not been started.
