**A BILL ENTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PIG INDUSTRY  
ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title  
Cap 210

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Pig Industry (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be read and construed as one with the Pig Industry Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

2. Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended in 5 the following respects—

(a) by substituting for the definition of “pig producer” the following definition—

“pig producer” means any person who owns or 10 keeps pigs,

(b) by inserting next after the definition of “licensed pig producer” the following definition—

“registered African pig producer” means an African pig producer registered under the provisions 15 of section 12 of this Ordinance

(3) No registered African pig producer shall, unless also duly licensed under the provisions of section 11 of this Ordinance, sell or supply any pig, nor shall any person purchase or accept any pig from him, otherwise than for consumption in the native area in which he resides or in a gazetted native area

(4) A district commissioner may cancel or refuse to renew the registration of any registered African pig producer who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance and where a district commissioner does so cancel or refuse to renew any such registration as aforesaid he shall, in the case of a registered African pig producer who is also a licensed pig producer, thereupon also cancel his licence

(5) (a) Any African pig producer whose application for registration has been refused, and any registered African pig producer whose registration has been cancelled or whose application for renewal of registration has been refused or who, being also a licensed pig producer, whose licence has also been cancelled may, in the prescribed manner, within thirty days of such refusal or cancellation, appeal against the same to the Provincial Commissioner of the Province in which he resides, and the Provincial Commissioner shall thereupon make such order as he thinks fit, so however that if, in the case of a registered African pig producer who is also a licensed pig producer, any such appeal is allowed cancellation of the licence shall also be withdrawn

(b) An order made under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this sub-section shall be final and conclusive, and shall not be liable to appeal to, or be questioned by, any court

14A (1) Any licensed pig producer who fails to submit any return required under the provisions of this Ordinance within the prescribed time, shall at the option of the Board be liable either to the penalty prescribed under this Ordinance or to a fine of one hundred shillings which shall be payable to the Board forthwith on receipt by the licensed pig producer of a notification sent by the Board by registered post stating that such return has not been rendered

(2) Any fine imposed by the Board under sub-section (1) of this section may be recovered by the Board by deducting it from any money due or which may become due to the pig producer by the Board

(3) Any licensed pig producer aggrieved by any decision of the Board made under the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section may, within thirty days of the date of the notification therein provided for, appeal in writing to the Member who shall determine the matter and may reduce or remit the fine

(4) Any determination by the Member under the provisions of sub-section (3) of this section shall be final and conclusive and shall not be subject to appeal to, or to be questioned by, any court

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will amend the Pig Industry Ordinance, Cap 210 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) in a number of respects which experience has shown to be desirable. Some of the amendments are designed to enable the Board to take more adequate steps to protect the industry from the possible effects, such as the spread of disease, of inefficient pig farming. The main amendments are explained hereunder. Others will provide for the management of the finances of the Board being subject, in future, to the approval of the Member.

The principal Ordinance requires a pig producer as defined in section 2 to be licensed. The present definition of pig producer, however, excludes a person who does not keep pigs for sale. In order to protect the industry from serious risk of disease resulting from mismanagement of pigs by persons who do not keep pigs for sale it is considered necessary that the Ordinance should extend also to persons who keep pigs for their own use. *Clause 2* will accordingly amend the definition of pig producer to provide for this. The opportunity has also been taken to insert in section 2 of the principal Ordinance a definition of "registered African pig producer".

*Clause 3* will amend section 3 of the principal Ordinance to provide for rotational retirement of members of the Board in order to ensure continuity of policy.

Section 9 of the principal Ordinance deals with restrictions on purchase, sale and export of pigs. Section 10 also deals with export. The sections have been redrafted so that the former will deal with purchase, sale and supply and the latter with export. Section 9 has also been amended so as to provide for the practice, which has been found desirable from experience, whereby the Board arranges for delivery of pigs direct to factories and butcheries.

*Clause 7* will amend section 11 of the principal Ordinance in certain respects. At present the Board is not expressly empowered to impose conditions in licences although such a power is to be inferred from the provisions of various sections of the principal Ordinance. The amendment to sub-section (2) will remedy this. As the Board wishes to have discretion in the matter of charging fees for licences sub-section (4) has been amended to provide for this.

*Clause 8* will amend section 12 of the principal Ordinance to provide a more adequate measure of control over African pig producers. In future a registered African pig producer will, if he wishes to trade outside a native area or a gazetted native area, be obliged to obtain a licence under section 11 of the principal Ordinance. The proposed amendment to the section will also confer power to refuse registration and to cancel licences where the African pig producer has contravened any of the provisions of the Ordinance. A right of appeal against such refusal or cancellation is given.

*Clause 9* repeals section 13 of the principal Ordinance the provisions of which are redundant by virtue of the amendments proposed to section 9.

*Clause 10* will insert a new section 14A the purpose of which is to ensure that returns are promptly and properly rendered by pig producers since the efficient control of the industry is largely dependent on the information obtained in these returns. The new section will enable the Board to impose fines for a failure to render a return subject to a right of appeal to the Member.

*Clause 11* will amend sub-section (1) of section 15 of the principal Ordinance to enable the Board at the time of fixing the quota of pigs of pig producers to fix the terms and conditions subject to which the Board will purchase pigs in excess of the quotas fixed.

*Clause 12* will amend section 16 of the principal Ordinance to provide for the separate licensing of retail operations by bacon factories, and will enable the Board to make *pro rata* reductions in the number of pig carcasses due for delivery to factories in the event, for instance, of there being shortage of available pigs. A right of appeal against such a reduction is conferred.

*Clause 14* will insert a new section 19A which will empower the Board to apportion expenses attributable to railage, shrinkage or



butchery of pigs among licensed bacon factories and butcheries in proportion to the number of pigs for which they are respectively accountable during the period in which the expenses are incurred

*Clause 18* will insert a new section 26A into the principal Ordinance, giving the Board power to cancel licences for a breach of any condition thereof. It is considered necessary for the Board to have this power to enable it to provide against the dangers to the industry resulting from continued mismanagement by pig producers. A right of appeal to the Governor in Council against cancellation is provided for.

*Clause 19* will amend section 27 of the principal Ordinance to enable the Board to make rules for the control of breeding stock, of management, and of the import of pig. Without these powers it is considered that the objects of the principal Ordinance cannot be fully achieved.

It is not expected that any additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.

### **A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTINUANCE IN FORCE OF THE CUSTOMS DUTIES ON FOODSTUFFS (PROVISIONAL EXEMPTION) ORDINANCE, 1946**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs Duties on Foodstuffs (Provisional Exemption) (Continuance in Force) Ordinance, 1952.

Continuance in force of the Customs Duties on Foodstuffs (Provisional Exemption) Ordinance, 1946  
No 34 of 1946

2. The Customs Duties on Foodstuffs (Provisional Exemption) Ordinance, 1946, shall for all purposes be deemed to have continued in force on and after the 1st day of January, 1952, and shall remain in force until the 31st day of December, 1952, and shall then expire unless continued in force in pursuance of the powers conferred by the proviso to section 3 of the said Ordinance.

#### MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 3 of the Customs Duties on Foodstuffs (Provisional Exemption) Ordinance, 1946 (No 34 of 1946), provided for the Ordinance to continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1947. By a proviso to that section the Governor, with the approval of the Legislative Council, was empowered to declare by notice in the Gazette, that the Ordinance should remain in force until a date to be fixed in the notice or until repealed. This power was exercised and the Ordinance was kept in force until the 31st December, 1951. In December, 1951, Legislative Council approved of the Ordinance being kept in force until the 31st December, 1952. By an oversight, however, the notice required by the proviso to section 3 was not published in the Gazette before the Ordinance expired. An Ordinance is, therefore, now necessary to give effect to the recommendation of Legislative Council that the Ordinance should remain in force until the 31st December, 1952.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.
