**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE COFFEE
MARKETING ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Coffee Marketing (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be read and construed as one with the Coffee Marketing Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Short title
Cap 202
- 5 2. The provisions of the principal Ordinance set out in the First Column of the Schedule hereto shall have effect subject to the minor amendments set out in relation thereto in the Second Column thereof

Amendments to principal Ordinance
3. Sections 15 and 27 of the principal Ordinance are repealed

Section 2	(a) There shall be inserted next after the definition of “Board” the following definition— “buni” means coffee dried in fruit but does not include hulled buni, (b) There shall be substituted for the definition of “coffee” the following— “coffee” means the fruit or any part of the fruit <i>Coffea arabica</i> and includes clean coffee, parchment coffee, and buni, but does not include roasted coffee,
Section 3	(a) There shall be inserted after the word “appointed” in paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) the word “annually” (b) There shall be substituted for paragraph (a) of sub-section (4) the following— (a) one of the members of the Board appointed under the provisions of paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of this section shall retire annually, but shall be eligible for reappointment (c) by adding the following new sub-section— (7) The Board shall have power to co-opt as a member of the Board any person whose assistance or advice it may require, but no such co-opted member shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Board or to be counted as a member for the purpose of constituting a quorum of the Board
Section 10	There shall be added at the end of the section the following words— “or to any committee whether constituted wholly of members of the Board or of members of the Board jointly with members of any body established in any other territory mentioned in section 21 of this Ordinance and having responsibilities for the marketing of coffee grown in such territory similar to the responsibilities of the Board”
Section 11	(a) Paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) shall be relettered as paragraph (d) and the following new paragraph shall be inserted— (c) no coffee planter shall roast coffee for sale, (b) There shall be substituted for the words “for such purposes and to such extent” which occur in the proviso to sub-section (1) the words “for such purposes, to such extent and subject to such conditions” (c) By adding the following new sub-section— (3) Any person aggrieved by any decision of the Board under the proviso to sub-section (1) of this section may, within twenty-one days after the date of such decision, appeal in writing to the Member

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Coffee Marketing Ordinance (Cap 202) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) will expire on the 30th June, 1952, unless steps are taken to prevent this

At the Annual Coffee Conference held last July it was unanimously recommended that the organized marketing of coffee should continue and that the Ordinance should accordingly not be allowed to expire. It was also recommended by the Conference that certain amendments which experience over a period of more than five years during which the Ordinance has been in operation has shown to be necessary should be made with a view to improving the control of the marketing of coffee and enabling the Board to set up a committee on which there will be representatives of any body in any other territory whose coffee is being marketed by the Board jointly with coffee produced in the Colony. As the amendments to the law which are necessary to accomplish these objects are comparatively minor it has been considered appropriate to effect them by means of a Schedule of Amendments (*Clause 2*)

Clause 3 repeals section 15 and section 27—the repeal of the latter section being necessary to remove the limitation of the period of duration of the principal Ordinance

The insertion in section 2 of the principal Ordinance of a definition of “buni” and the amendment of the definition of “coffee” to include buni are considered desirable in order to prevent the possibility in the future of growers evading the provisions of the Ordinance requiring sale of their coffee to the Board by the simple expedient of selling it in the form of “buni”

Section 3 of the principal Ordinance provides by paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) that one member of the Coffee Marketing Board shall be appointed by the Coffee Board. It is considered that this member should be appointed annually. The amendment effecting this change has rendered necessary also a consequential amendment to paragraph (a) of sub-section (4) of the section. A further amendment which the Bill will make to section 3 is the addition of a new sub-section enabling the Board to co-opt as a member any person whose assistance or advice it may require

The amendment which the Bill will make to section 10 of the principal Ordinance will enable the Board to delegate any of its functions to a committee which may include representatives of any body having functions similar to the Board established in any of the territories mentioned in section 21 of the principal Ordinance. By this means the Board will be enabled to have represented to them the views of any such body on behalf of which it markets coffee jointly with coffee grown in the Colony.

Section 15 of the principal Ordinance sets out the procedure by which the Board must deal with an application from a coffee planter to export coffee otherwise than through the Board. The Board considers this section to be unnecessary if the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 11 is amended so as to enable the Board to impose conditions upon granting an exemption under that section from any of the provisions of the Ordinance, and this Bill will accordingly repeal section 15 and amend the proviso under which the exemption may be granted to enable the Board to impose conditions and to render the exercise of the power of exemption by the Board subject to a right of appeal to the Member. The Bill will also amend section 11 to prohibit a coffee planter roasting coffee for sale. This merely gives legal force to the accepted practice.

Section 14 is amended by the addition of a new sub-section conferring a right of appeal to an Appeal Board to be established by rules made under section 24 against the classification by the Board of any coffee.

Sub-sections (3) and (4) of section 18 of the principal Ordinance have never been brought into force and it is not considered that any legal provision for disposal of coffee to the Ministry of Food is necessary. Sub-sections (2), (3) and (4) have accordingly been omitted and sub-section (1) has been amended in a verbal respect only.

As it is considered necessary that the Board should have power to create reserve funds for any purpose they may think fit, sub-section (2) of section 19 of the principal Ordinance has been amended by the insertion of a new paragraph authorizing this to be done.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.
