

Free passages are granted to the United Kingdom after a minimum tour of service in the case of a married officer with dependent children under 21, passages are provided up to the cost of three adult passages

Free medical treatment by the Government Medical Service Applicants should be between the ages of 25 and 29 Duties of the post consist largely of work in connexion with the Customs Waterguard and the detection and prevention of smuggling A uniform allowance of Sh 240 per annum is made

Candidates for the posts must produce evidence of a good standard of education The duties of Preventive Officers bring them into daily contact with all classes of the public and tact restraint and good bearing are essential requirements. After a period of training officers may be required to serve anywhere in Kenya, Uganda and Tanganyika
