# A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES (RECOVERY OF POSSESSION OF PROPERTY) ORDINANCE, 1951

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Local Authorities (Recovery of Possession of Property) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be read and construed as one with the Local Authorities (Recovery of Possession of Property) Ordinance, 1951, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Amendment of the Schedule to the principal Ordinance

2. The Forms in the Schedule to the principal Ordinance set out in the First Column of the Schedule to this Ordinance shall have effect subject to the minor amendments set out in relation thereto in the Second Column of such Schedule

# MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Local Authorities (Recovery of Possession of Property) Ordinance, 1951, was designed to permit the more speedy recovery in subordinate courts of the possession of premises held from local authorities but as the form of Complaint to a Magistrate (Form A of the Schedule to the Ordinance) is addressed solely to the legal tenant of the premises, and if, as is sometimes the case, the legal tenant leaves the premises and permits an unlawful occupant to occupy them, it appears doubtful whether a magistrate could issue a summons against such an occupant

This Bill will accordingly make the minor amendments to the forms in the Schedule which are considered necessary to place the matter beyond doubt

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

# AFRICAN REPRESENTATION IN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

THE following arrangements have been made for the selection of six Africans to be appointed by the Governor to represent African Interests in the new Legislative Council

- 2 One African will be appointed from each of the following constituencies
  - (a) Nairobi City
  - (b) The Central Province (less Nairobi City)
  - (c) The Coast Province
  - (d) The Rift Valley Province and the Masai Extra Provincial District
  - (e) Nyanza South (1 e the Nyanza Province, less the North Nyanza District)
  - (f) Nyanza North

#### Qualifications of Candidates

- 3 (1) Candidates must be Kenya Africans resident in the constituency for which they stand Their proposers, seconders and supportes must also be Kenya Africans resident in the constituency of the candidate whom they support
- (2) A candidate is not eligible for nomination if he has been convicted of a criminal offence and has been sentenced to imprisonment for a term of six months or more and has not received a pardon, provided that the Governor may remove such disqualification
- (3) The proposer, seconder and supporters must not have completed a twelve-months or longer term of imprisonment for a criminal offence within the last two years, unless they have received a pardon
- (4) Candidates, unless exempted by the Provincial Commissioner, must pass a test in English to be conducted by a committee of three officers of the Education Service The Provincial Education Officer will preside over this committee and nominate the two other members

#### Nomination

- 4 (1) Nomination papers must bear the signature of a proposer, seconder and seven additional supporters
  - (2) The nomination form is to be completed on oath
- (3) The nomination papers in the Nairobi City constituency must reach the District Commissioner within ten days of the publication of this notice. In other constituencies nomination papers must reach the District Commissioner within 14 days of the publication of this notice.
- (4) The District Commissioners will forward the valid nomination papers of candidates who possess the necessary qualifications except that of having passed the English test to the Provincial Commissioner District Commissioners in the Masai Extia Piovincial District will forward nomination papers to the Provincial Commissionei Rift Valley Province, through the Officei in Charge, Masai District Commissioners will inform the candidates of the date on which they are required to appear to take then English test The English test for the Natioble City constituency will be held at Natrobi, in the Central Province constituency at Nyeri in the Coast Province constituency at Mombasa, in the Rift Valley and Masai Extia Provincial District constituency at Nakuiu, in the Nyanza South constituency and in the Nyanza North constituency at Kısumu Arrangements for these English tests will be made by Provincial Commissioners
- (5) Nomination day in the Nairobi City constituency will will be 14 days after the publication of this notice. In the other constituencies nomination day will be 21 days after the publication of this notice. On nomination day the names of qualified candidates will be published at Provincial Headquarters and on the same day, or as soon after nomination day as possible at all District Headquarters.

# General

- 5 (1) On the date of the publication of this notice, District Commissioners having had advance copies of the notice will call in the chiefs and explain to them the procedure for nominating candidates and for selecting the names of candidates for submission to the Governor. The chiefs will then return to their locations, hold barazas and give publicity to these arrangements. In Nariobi and Mombasa, the District Commissioners will arrange the necessary publicity through the African Advisory Council and by such other means as they consider appropriate
- (2) A candidate who is an employee of Government or of a local authority should resign only if and when appointed by the Governor to be a representative member of the Legislative Council From nomination day to the date of appointment candidates should be granted leave with pay
- (3) Candidates may not sit on District Advisory Nomination Committees or Colleges
- (4) No person may be a candidate in more than one con stituency

(5) All questions concerning the qualifications of candidates or their nomination will be decided by Provincial Commissioners whose decision will be final

Procedure for the Selection of Candidates

- (a) Nairobi City Constituency
- 6 (1) Each of the 12 non-tribal Village Committees in the City will vote by secret ballot for the complete list of nominated candidates
- (2) Each Committee will then submit not more than three names to the City African Advisory Council which, less the ex officio members who are not City Councillors, will form the Advisory Nomination College
- (3) The Advisory Nomination College, presided over by the District Commissioner, will then vote by secret ballot on the list of candidates submitted to it by the Village Committees Each member will cast three votes in order of preference on a ballot paper containing the list of candidates submitted by the Village Committees The District Commissioner will assign points three, two and one respectively to the first second and third names on each paper. The three names obtaining most points will be sent to the Provincial Commissioner by the District Commissioner and will be forwarded by the Provincial Commissioner to the Governor with his recommendations.
- (4) The District Commissioner will arrange for the voting to be completed within two days of nomination day
- (b) The Central Province Constituency
- (1) Each Locational Council will send delegates (the exact number to be decided by the Provincial Commissioner) to form the District Advisory Nomination Committee which will be set up in each district These Committees will meet at District Headquarters six days after nomination day
- (2) Each District Advisory Nomination Committee will vote by secret ballot on a complete list of nominated candidates for the constituency Each member of the Committee will have one vote and the District Commissioner will forward the names of the three candidates obtaining most votes to the Provincial Commissioner
- (3) The Provincial Commissioner will assign points three two and one respectively to the first, second and third names from each District. He will then forward the names of the three candidates obtaining the most points to the Governor with his recommendations
- (c) The Coast Province Constituency
- (1) Each Locational Council or Local Area Committee, to be formed in such manner as the Provincial Commissioner directs, will send delegates (the exact number to be decided by the Provincial Commissioner) to form the District Advisory Nomination Committee which will be set up in each District These Committees will meet at District Headquarters six days after nomination day and will be informed of the names of the nominated candidates
- (2) The Mombasa African Advisory Council will act as the Mombasa District Advisory Nomination Committee
- (3) The Mombasa District Nomination Committee will send nine delegates to the Advisory Nomination College and the remaining five District Advisory Nomination Committees will each send three delegates to the Advisory Nomination College

In default of payment within the specified time the Chief Native Commissioner may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the plot
- 2 The grantee shall be responsible for the estimated proportionate costs of roads and drains serving the plot and will be required to pay the same within seven days of demand there-
