MOMBASA PORT CARGO PHASING ARRANGEMENTS—USE OF THE  
PORT OF TANGA

IT IS clear that to an increasing extent importers in East Africa are making use of the Port of Tanga to circumvent the phasing arrangements entered into by the shipping lines which have the effect of temporarily reducing the volume of cargo arrivals in Mombasa by shipping goods destined for Nairobi and other centres in Kenya and Uganda through the Port of Tanga.

The Port of Tanga is already dealing with an increasing volume of traffic proper to its own hinterland and is singularly ill-equipped, both from the point of view of port capacity and rail uplift from the Port, to cope with any increased volume of traffic. If this practice continues the only effect will be to bring about a state of congestion in Tanga worse than that which prevails in Mombasa for there is less hope of coping with it successfully in this small, confined lighterage Port.

The Administration therefore, gives notice that goods consigned through the Port of Tanga for ultimate despatch to centres which should properly be served by the Port of Mombasa will be liable to heavy delay in the Port, for the rail capacity will not be adequate to clear them and preference will, in the general public interest, be given to the clearance of goods which would normally use the port of Tanga.

## THE ELECTRIC POWER ORDINANCE

(Cap 174)

## ELECTRIC SUPPLY LINE (SCALE OF CHARGES) (MOMBASA), 1951

WHEREAS under the powers vested in him by section 27 of the Electric Power Ordinance the Governor may approve a scale of charges representing the cost of erecting any electric supply line requisitioned under the provisions of the aforesaid section

And whereas such powers have been delegated to the Postmaster General under Government Notice No 248 dated the 5th day of June, 1926

Now, therefore, in exercise of the aforesaid powers and of every other power enabling, the Postmaster General hereby approves the scale of charges set out hereunder —

1 For the provision by the East African Power and Lighting Company Limited, of a low-tension two-wire overhead electric supply line of standard design with copper conductors of a cross-sectional area of not more than 0.25 square inches to any owner or occupier of premises being within the area of supply of the said Company's Distributing Licence No 4 dated the 17th day of October, 1923, and situate within a radius of 20 miles from the Company's offices in Kilindini Road—

(a) to any premises within the limits of Mombasa Island—

(i) the rate of six shillings per yard for the first one hundred and twenty yards of any electric supply line of not more than a total length of two hundred yards from the point of attachment at the nearest electric supply line to the supply terminals,

(ii) the rate of two shillings per yard for each yard of any electric supply line in excess of one hundred and twenty yards, but not exceeding two hundred yards in total

length from the point of attachment at the nearest electric supply line to the supply terminals,

(b) in respect of electric supply lines to premises situate outside the limits of Mombasa Island but within a radial distance of five miles from the said offices in Kilindini Road a charge of twenty shillings additional to the appropriate charges calculated in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 (a) (i) and (ii) hereof,

(c) in respect of electric supply lines to premises situate at a radial distance exceeding five miles but not exceeding ten miles from the said offices in Kilindini Road a charge of forty shillings additional to the appropriate charges calculated in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 (a) (i) and (ii) hereof,

(d) in respect of electric supply lines to premises situate at a radial distance exceeding ten miles but not exceeding fifteen miles from the said offices in Kilindini Road a charge of sixty shillings additional to the appropriate charges calculated in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 (a) (i) and (ii) hereof,

(e) in respect of electric supply lines to premises situate at a radial distance exceeding fifteen miles but not exceeding twenty miles from the said offices in Kilindini Road a charge of eighty shillings additional to the appropriate charges calculated in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 1 (a) (i) and (ii) hereof

2 Nothing in this scale of charges shall render any such owner or occupier as aforesaid liable to pay for any length of such electric supply line—

(a) required to traverse any street or road reserve, or

(b) not exceeding twenty yards in length erected upon property not belonging to such owner or in possession of such occupier as the case may be

3 The scale of charges hereby approved shall not be altered at intervals of less than six calendar months from the date hereof

4 This scale of charges may be cited as the Electric Supply Line (Scale of Charges) (Mombasa), 1952, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of March in the year one thousand nine hundred and fifty-two

## SANSEVIERIA CUTTING RIGHTS, VOI AREA

(b) the amount of capital available for immediate development purposes, together with a banker's letter in support, and an indication of any further development planned to be undertaken after the first three years

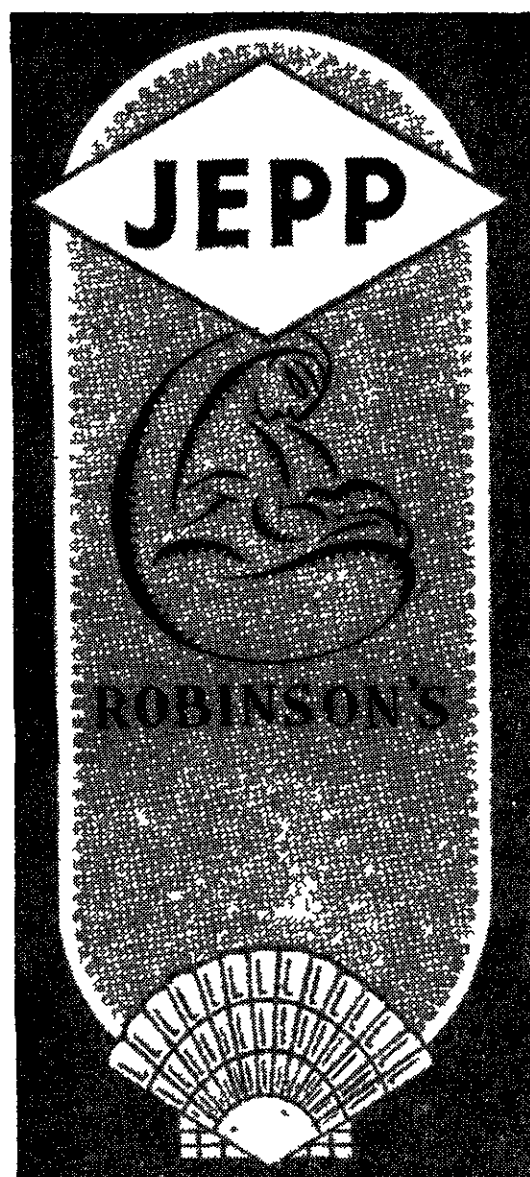
