Subject to paragraph 3 below, applications should be sent to the Chief Secretary, P O Box 621, Nairobi, to reach him by the 10th June 1952.

3 Applications from serving members of the Public Service should be accompanied by Form P 2 "Personal Record Form" and submitted through their heads of departments, and in the case of candidates from outside Kenya (the Chief Secretary of the territory in which they are serving), who will forward them with their recommendations, applications from candidates who are not in the Public Service should be submitted on Form P 1 "Application for Appointment to the Colonial Service" which can be obtained from the Chief Secretary of the territory in which the candidate is resident.

District Foremen Provincial Administration

APPLICATIONS are invited for two posts of District Foremen in the Provincial Administration. The successful applicants will be posted to Baringo or Elgeyo in the first instance in the Rift Valley Province, but it must be clearly understood that they will be liable to be posted at any time to any station in the Colony and Protectorate. Applications should be submitted to the Provincial Commissioner, Rift Valley Province, Nakuru, so as to reach him not later than 10th June, 1952.

The salary scale of the posts is £550 by £20 to £650 (Efficiency Bar) by £20 to £690 by £25 to £790 per annum. Initial salary to be determined in accordance with the candidate's age, experience and qualifications. In addition a temporary non-pensionable cost of living allowance is payable at current rates (at present 25 per cent of salary).

Terms and condition of service are as follows —

(a) For applicants not already in the Government Service appointment on probation for two years before admission to the permanent and pensionable establishments.

(b) Eighteen days' local leave per annum, and vacation leave at the rate of 4½ days for each completed month of residential service after 48 months' tour for officers under 40 and at the rate of 5½ days for each completed month of residential service after 40 months' tour for officers over 40.

(c) Free passages to the United Kingdom for the officer (and his wife if married) after completion of a tour of service, and return passages if he is returning for further service, in the case of a married officer with dependent children under 21 passages for himself and family are provided up to the cost of three adult passages or the actual cost of the passages, whichever is the less.

(d) When in occupation of Government quarters 10 per cent of salary is charged as rent if the quarters are furnished and

7½ per cent of salary if they are unfurnished, when an officer occupies private quarters he may claim an allowance up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 10 per cent of his salary if the quarters are furnished, and up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 7½ per cent of his salary if they are unfurnished.

(e) Free medical treatment by the Government medical service for the officer, his wife and dependent unmarried children under 21 years of age.

Applicants should possess a thorough knowledge of building, road making, bridge construction and the construction of dams and the installation of water supplies. In addition a knowledge of lorry and tractor maintenance is desirable. Applicants should be able to speak Swahili, and should be used to supervising African labour. They should also be prepared to spend most of their time on safari.
