EUROPEAN AGRICULTURAL SETTLEMENT BOARD

ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 1952

THE accounts of the board's activities presented herewith are prepared in accordance with the regulations made by the Hon the Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources under the provisions of the European Agricultural Settlement Ordinance, 1948, and subsequent amendments thereto.

The following notes are in amplification of the accounts and should be referred to as indicated thereon —

Note 1—Farms Leased to Tenants

One hundred and ninety-one farms are leased to tenant farmers as at date. The amount shown consists of the lease valuations plus the permanent improvements at cost erected thereon by the board, on the total of which the rent of the farms is calculated. Average per farm £5,324.

Note 2—Land Unoccupied

At date, five unoccupied farms are held by the board. Negotiations are proceeding for the sale of four of these to prospective purchasers. The fifth, to be subdivided to make two tenant farms, was purchased by the board this day.

Note 3—Sitoten Road

In order to provide a road of access for use, *inter alia* by the board's tenants in the Sitoten area, £6,000 of the board's funds were utilized. This sum at present stands on the books of the board as an advance to the Nakuru District Council, but the ultimate liability has not yet been determined.

Note 4—Livestock on Loan to Tenants

The board's policy is that every tenant under the Settlement Scheme should engage in mixed farming. To assist certain tenants, a Cattle Stocking Scheme was initiated as follows: Cattle are loaned under an agreement, for a period not exceeding five years, interest at 4½ per cent per annum being payable on the capital cost. At the end of the period the tenant has the option to purchase the cattle at the original cost, or to return to the board cattle to the value of the loan. As at date of these accounts, 14 tenants have been assisted under this scheme.

Note 5—Livestock for Farm Cleaning

During the year of account the board sold all the steers it had held for farm-cleaning purposes, as the farms for which they were originally acquired were considered to be clean.

Note 6—Livestock for Breeding at Konza

The board has recently inaugurated a new three-year scheme for the breeding, by insemination, of higher-grade heifers from the existing herd of half-breds.

Note 7—Fencing Wire

During the year under review the board disposed of all its stock of plain and barbed fencing wire except for 38 rolls.

Note 8—Survey Charges

The board endeavours to obtain survey of its farms as and when it is possible to do so. If a private surveyor is employed only 75 per cent of his charges are paid till the Director of Surveys has checked and approved the work. The amount shown is held in suspense till then, after which allocation to the farms concerned is made. All costs of survey are recoverable eventually when the farms are sold.

Note 9—Sundry Debtors

The board has sold various farms to settlers outside its Tenant Farming Scheme. In some cases the purchasers are permitted to retain 10 per cent of the purchase price pending survey and the issue of the grant of title. In other cases the full purchase price is payable by instalments. In all cases the unpaid balances bear interest.

The instalments of rent and/or interest on loans payable by tenants and assisted owners fall due on 30th September and 31st March in each year. A very large proportion of the total therefore, became due on the day of account, and of the £20,267 shown as due only £1,384 is in arrears.

Note 10—Crown and Forest Land

In addition to the Crown and forest land occupied by the board's tenants, the board acted as agents for Government in the sale on terms of one farm. For reasons of convenience the amount outstanding on this particular farm is included in Sundry Debtors to which the preceding note refers, and the value of the farm is shown as due to Government.

Note 11—Sundry Creditors

If, when the board purchases farms for settlement, the precise acreages of such farms are unknown, a proportion of the cost is withheld pending survey. The amount involved concerns ten farms.

The amount shown as due to Miscellaneous Creditors consists almost entirely of sums due to other Government departments for various services.

Note 12—Prepayments

Certain tenant farmers have deposited sums to the credit of their accounts to provide for the payment of rent, etc., to fall due in the future.

Note 13—Reserve for Administrative Expenditure

As the contribution by Government towards the board's administrative expenditure covers the whole of the year 1952, an amount considered adequate for the remaining nine months has been reserved.

Note 14—Reserve for Waivure of Charges

In accordance with the terms of White Paper No 1 of 1950, the board approved periods of moratoria on Rent and Interest Payments to certain tenants and assisted owners. Subject to certain safeguards which have been devised, payment of the sums accruing as Rent and Interest during these periods can be waived, and during the year of account the sum of £10,178 was written off. Additional provision from surpluses was made to meet the increased liability under this head.

Note 15—Reserve for Bad and Doubtful Debts

During the year of account one small debt of £6 was written off and no further provision was considered necessary.

Note 16—Reserve for Repairs and Renewals

During the year of account an expenditure of £1,310 was incurred in repairing and/or renewing various farm buildings damaged or destroyed by fire or other causes for which no one could be held responsible. This figure also includes 25 per cent of the cost of one unsuccessful borehole, as the Government subsidy covered only 75 per cent of its cost.

Additional provision from surpluses was made to meet any liability under this head which may arise in the future.

Note 17—Reserve for Depreciation

During the year of account the sum of £4,121 was written off as depreciation of various of the board's movable assets, the bulk of which consisted of fencing wire. As the quantity of loose assets owned by the board has diminished considerably no additional provision is considered necessary.
