A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE EUROPEAN CIVIL SERVICE PROVIDENT FUND ORDINANCE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

Cap 70

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the European Civil Service Provident Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be read and construed as one with the European Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Amendment of section 5 of the principal Ordinance

- 2. Section 5 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—
 - (a) by substituting for the full stop at the end of paragraph (h) of sub-section (1) a semi-colon followed by the word "or" and by adding the following new 10 paragraph—
 - (i) on or after the 1st January, 1946, except by an officer who elected not to be subject to the new terms of service contained in Government Secretariat, Circular No 68 of the 1st October, 1948, 15

and

- (b) by adding the following new sub-section—
 - (3) Where an officer who elected for the new terms of service contained in Government Secretariat Circular No 68 of the 1st October, 1948, made con-20 tributions to the Fund since the 1st January, 1946, he shall be entitled to have refunded to him a sum equal to such contribution together with interest thereon

Insertion of new section 7A in the principal Ordinance Special provisions

consequent upon new terms of

service

3. The principal Ordinance is amended by inserting next after section 7 the following new section—

7A Notwithstanding the provisions of section 7 of this Ordinance, where a contributor (other than a contributor who was appointed or selected for appointment to a pensionable office prior to the 3rd day of September, 1948) has, consequent upon the new terms of service con-30 tained in Government Secretariat Circular No 68 of the 1st October, 1948, and any amendments or additions thereto, been, or been deemed to have been, confirmed in a pensionable office, no payment shall be made to the contributor from the Fund of any contributions made 35 from the general revenue or of any contribution made by the contributor in respect of the period between the date on which the contributor attained the age of twenty years and the 1st day of January, 1946, and no interest shall be payable thereon in either case, any such 40 moneys remaining in the Fund shall be paid into the general revenue of the Colony

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will make certain amendments to the European Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance (Cap 70) rendered necessary by the introduction of new terms of service with effect from the 1st January, 1946

Under the new terms of service all European Provident Fund posts became pensionable, and contributors to the Provident Fund on electing for pensionable terms were, in consequence, required to cease contributing with effect from 1st January, 1946 Clause 2 (a) of the Bill will amend section 5 of the principal Ordinance so as to debar an officer from contributing to the Fund after the 1st January, 1946, unless he elected not to be subject to the new terms of service Clause 2 (b) of the Bill will authorize the refund (with interest) of any contributions made by the officer after the 1st January, 1946

A contributor on electing for the new terms of service was required to surrender all Government contributions and his own contributions made in respect of the period between the date when he attained the age of 20 years and the 1st January, 1946 Clause 3 of the Bill will legalize the surrender of the contributions and their payment into the general revenue of the Colony

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Asian Civil Service Provident Fund (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be read and construed as one with the Asian Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance

- 2. Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—
 - (a) by substituting for the full stop at the end of paragraph (h) of sub-section (1) a semi-colon followed by the word "or" and by adding the following new 10 paragraph—
 - (1) on or after the 1st January, 1946, except by an officer who elected not to be subject to the new terms of service contained in Government Secretariat Circular No 68 of the 1st October, 15 1948,

and

- (b) by adding the following new sub-section—
 - (3) Where an officer who elected for the new terms of service contained in Government Secretariat 20 Circular No 68 of the 1st October, 1948, made contributions to the Fund since the 1st January, 1946, he shall be entitled to have refunded to him a sum equal to such contributions together with interest thereon

3. The principal Ordinance is amended by inserting next after section 8 the following new section—

Insertion of new section 8A in the principal Ordinance Special provisions consequent upon new terms of service

....

8A Notwithstanding the provisions of section 8 of this Ordinance, where a contributor has, consequent upon the new terms of service contained in Government Secre-30 tariat Circular No 68 of the 1st October, 1948, and any amendments or additions thereto been, or deemed to have been confirmed in a pensionable office, no payment shall be made to the contributor from the Fund of any contributions made from the general revenue or of any 35 contribution made by the contributor in respect of the period between the date on which the contributor attained the age of twenty years and the 1st day of January, 1946, and no interest shall be payable thereon in either case, any such moneys remaining in the Fund 40 shall be paid into the general revenue of the Colony

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill will make certain amendments to the Asian Civil Service Provident Fund Ordinance (Cap 72) rendered necessary by the introduction of new terms of service introduced with effect from the 1st January, 1946

Under the new terms of service all Asian Provident Fund posts became pensionable, and contributors to the Provident Fund on electing for pensionable terms were, in consequence, required to cease contributing with effect from the 1st January, 1946 Clause 2 (a) of the Bill will amend section 6 of the principal Ordinance so as to debar an officer from contributing to the Fund after the 1st January, 1946, unless he elected not to be subject to the new terms of service Clause 2 (b) will authorize the refund (with interest) of any contributions made by the officer after the 1st January, 1946

A contributor on electing for the new terms of service was required to surrender all Government contributions and his own contributions made in respect of the period between the date when he attained the age of twenty years and the 1st January, 1946 Clause 3 of the Bill will legalize the surrender of the contributions and their payment into the general revenues of the Colony

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law


