## (*Cap* 219)

TROUT FISHING IN THE NORTH CHANIA RIVER IN THE NYERI DISTRICT

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Trout Ordinance, 1 hereby declare that -

- (1) Government Notice No 1406 of 25th December, 1951, 18 cancelled with effect from 1st August 1952
- (2) The North Chania River from its source and its tribu taries from their sources, to the point where it joins the Zaina Rivei (such point being  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile up stream from the Chania River Fishing Camp and marked by a notice board), is closed for the purpose of trout fishing
