A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ORDINANCE

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows—

Short title

Cap 48

Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance

Repeal and replacement of section 3 of the principal Ordinance

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Holidays (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, and shall be read and construed as one with the Public Holidays Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

- 2. Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended by 5 deleting the words "which days are in this Ordinance referred to as public holidays" appearing therein and the brackets enclosing the same
- 3. There shall be substituted for section 3 of the principal Ordinance the following section—
 - 3 The Governor may at any time if he thinks fit, by Proclamation, declare any day to be a public holiday either in addition to the days mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance or in substitution for any of such days and either throughout the Colony or in any district, area 15 or part thereof and thereupon any day so appointed shall be a public holiday in all respects as if it were a day mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance, in the Colony or the locality specified in such Proclamation, and where, in any year, any day is so declared to be a 20 public holiday in substitution for any of the days mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance such latter day shall in such year cease to be a public holiday in the Colony or the locality specified in the Proclamation

Repeal and replacement of section 4 of the principal Ordinance

- 4. There shall be substituted for section 4 of the 25 principal Ordinance the following section—
 - 4 Where, in any year, the day mentioned in the Schedule falls on a Sunday, then the first succeeding day, not being a public holiday, shall in such year be a Public Holiday in all respects as if it were a day men-30 tioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance and such first-mentioned day shall, in such year, cease to be a public holiday

Amendment of section 6 of the principal Ordinance

5. Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "public holiday appointed by or 35 under this Ordinance", wherever those words appear in the section the following words "a day which is a public holiday by virtue of the provisions of this Ordinance"

Amendment of the Schedule to the principal Ordinance 6. The Schedule to the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for the words "King's Day", appearing therein, 40 the words "Queen's Day"

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 3 of the Public Holidays Ordinance provides that the Governor may, at any time he thinks fit, by Proclamation, declare any day to be a public holiday in addition to those mentioned in the Schedule to the Ordinance or in substitution for any of them and thereupon such day shall be a public holiday as if it were mentioned in the Schedule to the Ordinance It is desired to amend this section so that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any day to be

a public holiday in a certain area, or in certain areas, and not necessarily throughout the Colony Clause 2 of the Bill, which makes a minor amendment to section 2 of the Ordinance, and clause 3 which recasts section 3 of the Ordinance will accomplish this

The opportunity has been taken also to recast section 4 of the Ordinance (which needed clarification) and to make a minor amendment to section 6 (clauses 4 and 5 of the Bill)

The Schedule to the Ordinance provides for a public holiday on "King's Day (the second Monday in October)' King's Day came into being for the purpose of providing a public holiday between the first Monday in August and Christmas Day It is considered appropriate to change the name of this public holiday to "Queen's Day", and clause 6 of the Bill will amend the Schedule accordingly

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

Assistant Inspector Graham Robert Clarke Sergeant Leo Shule s/o Shule, No 1932 Constable Alı s/o Abdı, No 584 Constable Ethinyon s/o Barua, No 4599

At dawn on 31st March, 1952, Assistant Superintendent E G Wright with a force of 40 African police was about to enter a tribal village in the Marsabit district to search for illegal firearms. His entry was repulsed with heavy rifle fire from between 250 and 300 Gelubba, a tribe noted for its war-like qualities and good marksmanship. The engagement continued for seven hours, when it was broken off by the police as ammunition was becoming short, by that time the police had lost one dead and two wounded, and the tribesmen had suffered some 20 dead and more wounded

Assistant Superintendent Wright commanded his men during the engagement with gallantry of the highest order Although his force was heavily outnumbered and its position had become most dangerous he remained on the attack and courted extreme danger to rescue a section who had been cut off until he and his men were virtually surrounded with their ammunition supply running very low His leadership of his men throughout was exceptionally fine. He personally rendered first-aid successfully to the wounded, under heavy fire, showing complete indifference to his own danger. His cool and excellent judgment and example of steadiness and courage enabled his force to extricate itself from a position of extreme danger.

Assistant Inspector G R Clarke set out at dawn on 31st March, 1952, in command of 20 African police to seize firearms illegally kept in a tribal village in the Marsabit district He found the village deserted, but, on withdrawing from it, he heard heavy firing some seven miles away, where he knew his senior officer, Assistant Superintendent Wright, had taken a force for similar and simultaneous action. Without hesitation Assistant Inspector Clarke led his party towards the sound of firing and soon observed considerable armed reinforcements hastening to the attack of Assistant Superintendent Wright's force With his party on foot, he hastened over difficult country, in great heat, forced his way through armed opposition and joined his senior officer whose position at that time was extremely perilous He led his own force with great ability His courage and coolness and lack of thought for his own safety were of the highest order and the finest example to his men during the whole engagement

Sergeant Leo Shule s/o Shule On 31st March 1952, in the Marsabit district, Sergeant Leo Shule was in command of a platoon involved in the above engagement During the whole of the action Sergeant Shule showed complete disregard of danger, a very high standard of leadership and professional skill, and exceptional coolness under fire His cheerfulness and encouragement to his men was a fine example to them and contributed greatly to the successful withdrawal of the police

Constable Alı s/o Abdı was a member of a patrol which came under a fierce attack by very superior numbers of riflearmed tribesmen He displayed great gallantry and indifference to danger When one of the Bren Gunners was wounded Constable Alı took over the gun, kept it in action and used it with great effect on the enemy He set a fine example of coolness and skill to his men

Constable Ethinyon s/o Barua This Constable was a Bren Gunner in the engagement By his cool courage, indifference to hostile fire and skilful use of his Bren Gun Constable Ethinyon was instrumental in clearing a ridge of the enemy, thereby enabling his party to occupy it and take up a defensive position. He kept his gun in action during the whole of the period of fighting and was an outstanding example and an inspiration to his comrades






