**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE MUNICIPALITIES
AND TOWNSHIPS (PRIVATE STREETS) ORDINANCE, 1951**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipalities and Townships (Private Streets) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952 and shall be read and construed as one with the Municipalities and Townships (Private Streets) Ordinance, 1951, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance

2. Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended in the following respects—

(a) by deleting the definition of the expression “public street”, appearing therein,

(b) by inserting the following definitions in their appropriate alphabetical positions in the section—

“appropriate date” means in relation to the area of any local authority—

Cap 135

(a) where, at any time, any of the provisions of the Townships (Private Streets) Ordinance (hereby repealed) have been applied to the area or any part thereof, the date upon which any such provisions were first so applied,

Cap 135

(b) where none of the provisions of the Townships (Private Streets) Ordinance (hereby repealed) have at any time been applied to the area, or any part thereof, the date upon which any of the provisions of this Ordinance were first applied to the area or any part thereof,

“private street” means any street which is not a public street,

“public street” means in relation to the area of any local authority—

(a) any street which was, at the appropriate date, being ordinarily repaired or maintained wholly by the local authority,

(b) any street which has been or is, by virtue of the provisions of this Ordinance, deemed to have been declared by the local authority, under the provisions of this Ordinance or the Townships (Private Streets) Ordinance (hereby repealed) to be a public street

Provided that—

(i) where a portion only of a street was, at the appropriate date, being so repaired or maintained, the remainder of such street shall, unless it has been, or is, by virtue of

the provisions of this Ordinance, deemed to have been declared to be a public street in manner aforesaid, be deemed to be a private street for the purposes of this Ordinance, and

(ii) a street shall be deemed to be a private street for the purposes of this Ordinance notwithstanding that it, or any portion thereof, has been or been deemed to be a public street, under any law in force at any time after the appropriate date and before the commencement of the Municipalities and Townships (Private Streets) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, unless such street has been, or is, by virtue of the provisions of this Ordinance, deemed to have been, declared to be a public street in manner aforesaid

3. There shall be substituted for section 7 of the principal Ordinance the following—

Repeal and replacement of section 7 of the principal Ordinance

7 (1) Where any private street or part thereof has been levelled, paved or metalled, kerbed, channelled, lighted, sewered and drained, or otherwise made good in a permanent manner by or to the satisfaction of the local authority, the local authority shall forthwith declare the same to be a public street, and thereupon such street or part thereof shall cease to be a private street and shall become a public street

Private street when properly paved, etc., to be declared public street

(2) Where prior to the commencement of the Municipalities and Townships (Private Streets) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, any private street or part thereof had been levelled, paved or metalled, kerbed, channelled, lighted, sewered and drained or otherwise made good in a permanent manner by or to the satisfaction of the local authority, the local authority shall be deemed to have thereupon declared the same to be a public street and such street or part thereof shall, for the purposes of this Ordinance, be deemed to be a public street

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

The Municipalities and Townships (Private Streets) Ordinance, 1951, provides a means whereby any private street after being constructed to a standard acceptable to the local authority at the expense of the owners of property fronting thereon, may be taken over by the local authority and thereafter maintained at the cost of the ratepayers at large. The Ordinance allows this only in the case of private streets, the procedure is not applicable to public streets. The definition of "public street" in the Ordinance is—

"any street which is or has been, ordinarily repaired or maintained wholly by the Government or by any local authority, or which has become vested in its entirety in a local authority"

The Government finds it convenient in laying out residential or business areas to construct the estate streets but the Government does not necessarily construct these streets in the first place to the municipal standards. If the Government thereafter regularly repairs or maintains such a street the street becomes by definition a public street and the standard of construction cannot thereafter be improved at the expense of the plot-holders.

It is considered to be inequitable that plot-holders on Government estates should, merely as a result of a statutory definition, escape a liability which falls upon all other plot-holders and it is therefore proposed to amend the Ordinance by repealing the definition quoted in paragraph 1 of this Memorandum and substituting therefor a new definition designed to make it clear that only those streets which have been made up to the local authority's standards, or which were being ordinarily repaired or maintained by the local authority when the Ordinance or its predecessor came into force in the area, shall be public streets maintainable by the local authority (*clause 2 of the Bill*)

Clause 3 makes a consequential amendment requiring the local authority to adopt a street where it has been made up to the required standards

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Cap 27

Section 14 of the Criminal Procedure Code empowers the Governor to direct that any area of the Colony shall be a Special District and section 15 provides that the Governor may empower any officer in charge of a Special District, holding a subordinate court of the first class, to try any offence and to pass any sentence which the Supreme Court may pass. Certain areas of the Colony have recently been created Special Districts but under the existing law only District Commissioners are authorized to exercise these powers. It is considered desirable that the law should be extended to empower Resident Magistrates, in addition to District Commissioners, to exercise such jurisdiction and *clause 2* of the Bill will effect this purpose.

The opportunity has been taken to deal with a conflict between sections 360 and 371 of the Code, dealing with the right of appeal to the Court of Appeal for Eastern Africa. Section 360 was amended in 1945 with the intention of providing an appeal from the Supreme Court in all cases other than those in which the Supreme Court acts in revision. Section 371, however, provides that the decision of the Supreme Court on a case stated by a subordinate court "shall be final and conclusive on all parties" and the consequential amendment to delete these words was omitted from the 1945 amending Ordinance. *Clause 3* of the Bill will repair this omission and remove the existing inconsistency in the wording of the two sections.

5 The grantee shall be required to pay all rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be charged, assessed, levied or imposed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the Government in lieu thereof

6 The cost of the construction of roads, drains and sewers to serve the plot shall be payable by the grantee on demand

Special Conditions Applicable to Plots in Schedule No 1

City Council and the Commissioner of Lands may at their entire discretion, permit architectural structures of a height in excess of 100 feet

6 Successful tenderers may be required to submit at their own expense simple models of the proposed buildings

Special Conditions Applicable to the Plot in Schedule No 2

1 The premises may be used for the purposes of a department store only

2 The grantee shall not do or permit to be done on the premises anything which is or might become a nuisance

3 The building shall be designed and erected to a high architectural standard

4 The design and colour of the building and lettering thereon shall be as approved by the City Council

5 The height of the exterior walls shall not exceed 42 feet and thereafter any height of the buildings in excess of 42 feet otherwise than on the exterior walls shall be as the Commissioner of Lands and the City Council may approve with due regard to angles of light

6 The successful tenderer may be required at his own expense to submit a simple model of the proposed building

Special Conditions Applicable to the Plot in Schedule No 3

1 The plot shall be used for the purposes of a cinema and shops only

2 Those portions of the plot fronting on a street or footpath shall be developed as far as possible in conformity with the proposed development of the plots in Schedules Nos 1 and 2

3 The building shall be designed and erected to a high architectural standard

4 The external appearance including the colour of such building and lettering thereon shall be as the City Council may approve

5 The height of the exterior walls shall not exceed 42 feet and thereafter any height of the buildings in excess of 42 feet otherwise than on the exterior walls shall be as the Commissioner of Lands and the City Council may approve with due regard to angles of light

6 The successful tenderer may be required to submit at his own expense a simple model of the proposed building
