## BRITISH PROPERTY RIGHTS AND INTERESTS IN JAPAN

IT IS hereby notified for public information that provision has been made in the Treaty of Peace with Japan for the return to its owners of the property of each Allied Power and its nationals which was in Japan at any time between 7th December, 1941, and 2nd September, 1945. Where property has not yet been returned, or where the owner has not yet accepted the return of his property, an application for its return must be made to the Japanese Government within nine months of the date of coming into force of the Treaty i.e. before 28th January, 1953.

The treaty also provides for compensation in respect of loss of or damage to the property of Allied Powers and their nationals which was within Japan on 7th December, 1941. To give effect to this provision of the Treaty the Japanese Government has promulgated a special law the Allied Powers Property Compensation Law. Under this law property owners wishing to claim compensation for loss or damage must, if they have not already done so, apply within nine months of the coming into force of the Treaty for the return of their property. This will entail acceptance of any damaged property which is returnable in its present state. Claims for compensation must then be lodged with the Japanese Government within eighteen months of the coming into force of the Peace Treaty, i.e. before 28th October, 1953.

It has been arranged that applications for return of property and claims for compensation are to be made through the Government of each Allied Power. The Government of the United Kingdom has therefore arranged for the presentation of applications for return and claims for compensation by British subjects including British subjects resident in Colonial territories to be made through the British Embassy in Tokyo.

Property which may be the subject of a claim includes movable and immovable property, bank balances or debts which have been paid into the Special Property Administration Account in the Bank of Japan. It does *not* include monetary credits or debts which have not been so paid.

Any British subject in Kenya who has property or interests in Japan which fall within the above description should communicate at once with the Custodian of Enemy Property P.O. Box 1892, Nairobi from whom full details and advice may be obtained.
