PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT OF CALL UP

PURSUANT to the provisions of section 11 of the Compulsory Military Training Ordinance, 1951, notice is hereby given that the following persons will be called up for compulsory military training during the year 1953 —

All persons liable for initial training under the provisions of the Compulsory Military Training Ordinance, 1951, who, on the 1st day of January, 1953—

- (a) will not have completed such initial training, and
- (b) will have attained the age of 18 years but will not have attained the age of 20 years, or will have attained the age of 22 years but will not have attained the age of 23 years

All persons affected by this notice are hereby required to notify the Director of Manpower, P O Box 326, Nairobi, of the following particulars within 30 days of the date of this notice —

- (a) Full names in block letters
- (b) Postal address
- (c) Date and place of birth
- (d) Whether married or single

Provided that if at the date of this notice any person to whom it is applicable has not yet arrived in the Colony or is temporarily absent from the Colony or for any other sufficient reason is unable to comply with this notice, such person shall, within 30 days after the date of his arrival in or return to the Colony or within 30 days after the cessation of such other sufficient reason as aforesaid, notify the Director of Manpower of his name and address

The undermentioned classes of persons are not liable under the Compulsory Military Training Ordinance, 1951, to compulsory military training —

- (a) Officers, warrant officers, non commissioned officers and men of—
 - (i) the Royal Navy, the Regular Army and the Royal Air Force,
 - (ii) the existing reserves of the Royal Navy, Army and Royal Air Force,
 - (iii) the Territorial Army and the Territorial Army Reserves,

- (b) Officers, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers and men of the Kenya Regiment and the Royal East African Navy who joined such Regiment or Navy before 1st July, 1951, for so long a time as they continue to serve with the said Regiment or with the said Navy
- (c) Any person who has already completed the full course of training required by any legislation relating to compulsory national service in the United Kingdom or in any other part of Her Majesty's Dominions
- (d) Civilians engaged in the United Kingdom who are serving with any of Her Majesty's Forces in the Colony or in a civil department of the Imperial Government
- (e) Members of the Kenya Police Force established under the Police Ordinance, 1948 (but not including the Kenya Police Reserve)
- (f) Ministers of religion who have undergone a ceremony of ordination in a recognized church
- (g) Any person whose presence in the Colony is governed by an "in transit pass" or a "visitor's pass" or a "special pass" or a "pupil's pass" issued under the provisions of the Immigration (Control) Regulations
- (h) Any person who is, under the provisions of any act in force in a Dominion, a national or citizen of that Dominion within the meaning of that Act or who is a person domiciled in a Dominion, if in either case he has been ordinarily resident in the Colony for less than two years

For the purpose of this notice "Dominion" means a Dominion within the meaning of the Statute of Westminster, 1931

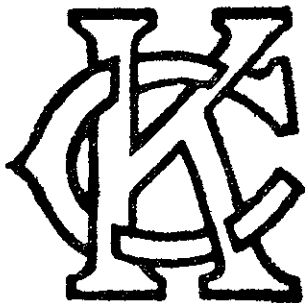

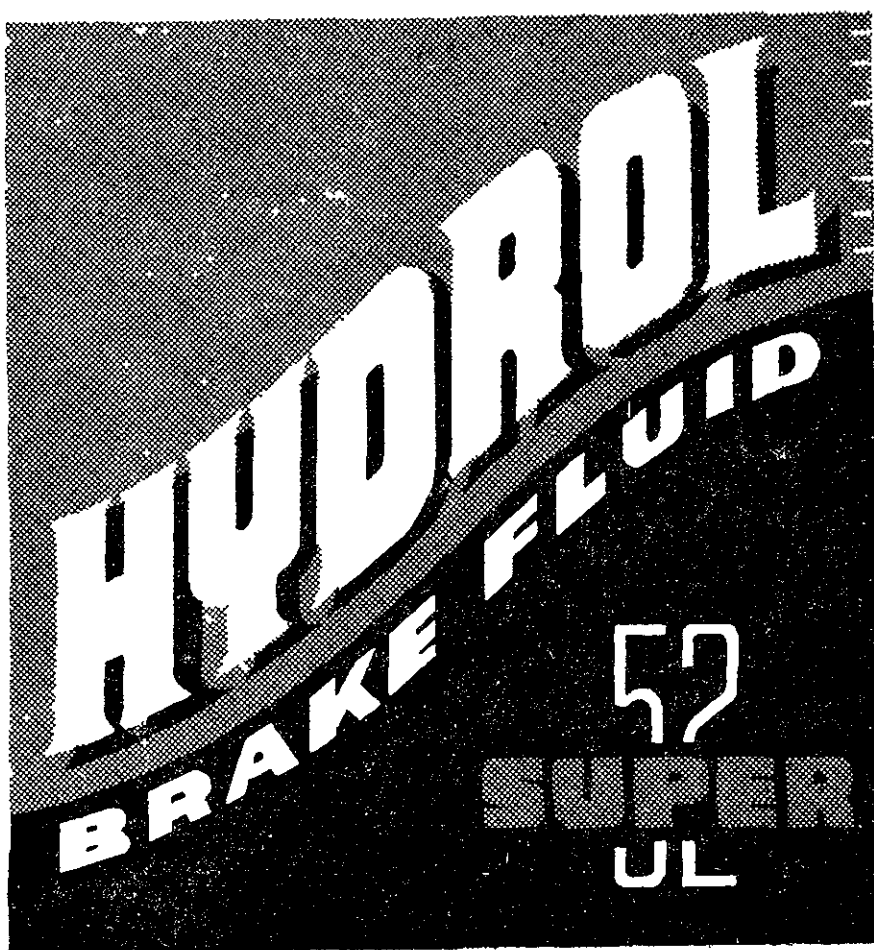
