NOTICE OF IMPOSITION OF CESS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 25 of the Pig Industry Ordinance, the Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources, on the recommendation of the Pig Industry Board, hereby imposes a cess of 3 per cent on the price of pigs supplied to the Board subject to the following conditions—


