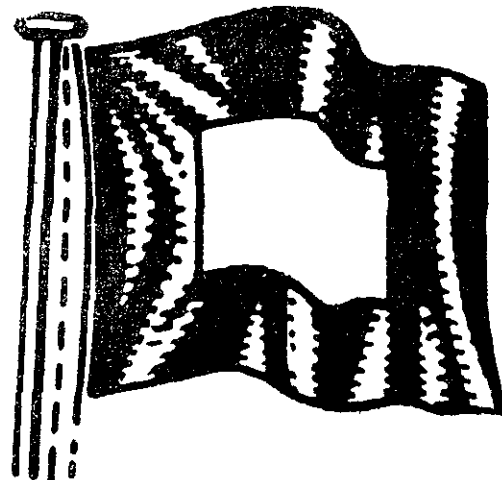

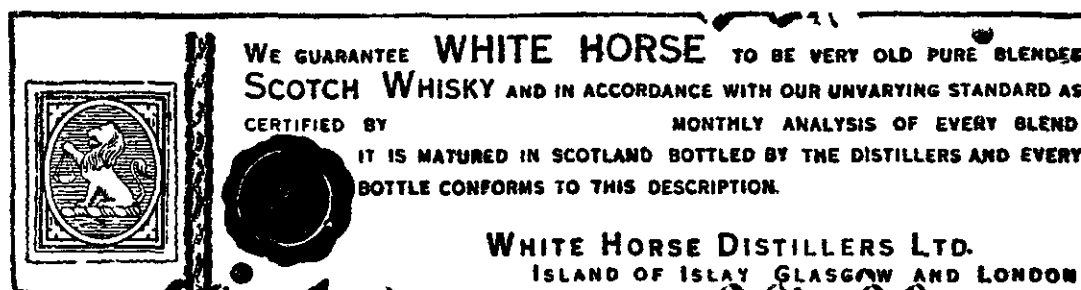

(1) The area shall be used exclusively for the manufacture, storage and sale of salt and for works and purposes connected directly therewith, and the lessee shall have liberty to search, dig, bore, sink for work, win, manufacture, carry away and dispose of the salt rock and brine and produce thereof

(3) The quality of the salt manufactured and sold shall be to the satisfaction of the Governor

(4) Within three years from the date of the commencement of the term, the lessee shall complete the installation of a plant capable of producing five thousand tons (5,000 tons) of salt per annum

(5) The lessee shall take active and effective steps continually to prevent the breeding of mosquitoes on the area to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health for the District

(6) The lessee shall generally indemnify Her Majesty against any claims arising from any accidents, loss or damage sustained by any person or persons occasioned by the operations of the lessee under this lease

(7) Her Majesty shall not be responsible for any adverse effect caused by any structural work or works which may be undertaken in the neighbourhood of the area

(8) The Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint shall have the right at all reasonable times of inspecting the works and books of the lessee

(9) The lessee shall render to the Commissioner of Lands accounts and plans of operations on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December in each year

(10) At all times natives in the locality of the area shall have the free right to take away for their own use and not for sale or barter any brine or salt in its natural state without let or hindrance at such points as may be agreed upon to the satisfaction of the District Commissioner

(11) The lessee shall not assign, sub-let or otherwise part with the possession of the land or any part thereof without the previous consent of the Governor in writing

(12) A minimum production of not less than 5 000 tons of salt per annum shall be effected by the end of the fourth year of the term of the lease and shall be so maintained for the whole period of the lease

(13) Her Majesty shall have the option of purchasing the machinery and plant upon the said land on the expiration or sooner determination of the lease at a price if not otherwise agreed upon to be determined by arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration Ordinance (Cap 22)

(14) The lease when issued will be for the purpose set out in (1) above and will not in any way extend to any other mineral rights which are expressly reserved to the Crown

(15) If the lessee shall fail to comply with the development conditions in Clause (4) above the licence shall be liable to forfeiture

(16) Substantial cessation of operations in any area for a period of 12 months shall be deemed abandonment of that area which will then revert to Her Majesty, unless due cause be shown to the satisfaction of Her Majesty. Substantial cessation of operations over the total area for a period of 12 months shall render the licence liable to forfeiture

(17) Residences of employees and such buildings as may be necessary for the housing of the employees on the area will be allowed if approved by the Medical Officer of Health for the District

(18) A deposit of Sh 4,000 shall be made within 14 days of the applicant being informed that his application in respect of this concession has been successful, returnable on the expiration of the term of the lease, provided the conditions thereof have been complied with to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands

(19) A royalty of Sh 2 per ton of salt extracted shall be payable to the Commissioner of Lands
