MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

It is considered desirable that personnel serving in the Kenya Regiment and the Kenya Police Reserve during the present emergency should be safeguarded in respect of reinstatement in their civil employment on their release from these two forces or on the termination of the Emergency. This Bill is designed to achieve this object. Its provisions will also apply to any duty or service which the Governor in Council may declare to be national service for the purpose of the Ordinance.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law.

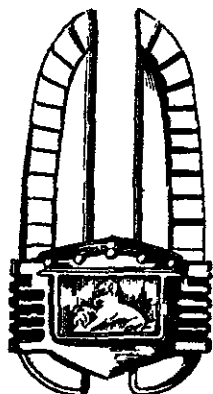

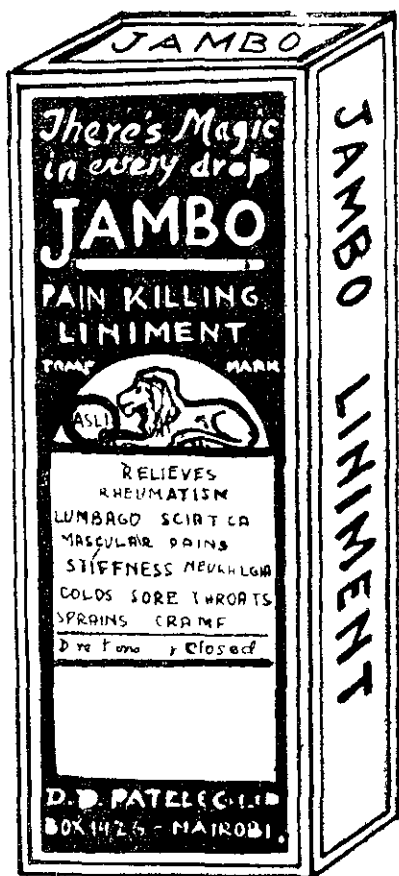
