CLAUSE 9—*Towage and Hire of Tugs Lighters and Pontoons*

Delete Clause 9 and substitute the following therefor

CLAUSE 9—*Towage and Hire of Tugs Lighters and Pontoons*

For the purpose of this schedule, "vessels" shall include all ships, native vessels, small craft, lighters and pontoons "Steam" shall include all power used for mechanical propulsion

When more than one vessel is towed at a time, a reduction of 25 per cent may be made on these charges in respect of each vessel so towed

(b) if vessel not under own steam 250

Note—For the purpose of this sub section Kilindini Harbour and Mombasa Old Port shall be deemed to be separate Ports Movements between these two Ports shall be at the rates specified in sub section (iv) below

(iv) Moving vessels from or to a point within harbour limits to a point outside harbour limits but within 2 miles of such limits, for each tug employed

(a) if vessel under own steam 225

(b) if vessel not under own steam 450

(b) *Tug Services for Vessels of Under 250 NRT*

Rates on Application

(c) In addition to the foregoing, other towage services shall, at the convenience of the management be performed at rates which can be had on application

(d) *Hire of Lighters and Pontoons*

Lighters and/or pontoons may be hired, if available, on request at cents 75 per ton of lighter or pontoon capacity, per day or part thereof

(This charge does not include towage)

This will come into effect from 1st January 1953

Radio Engineer Social Development Department

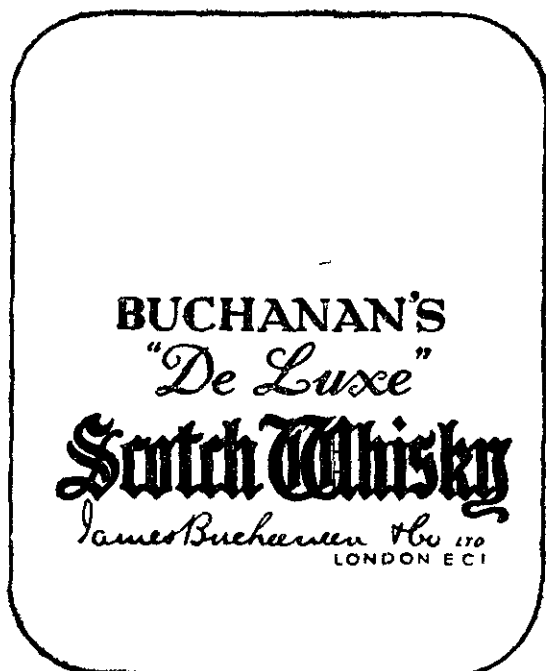

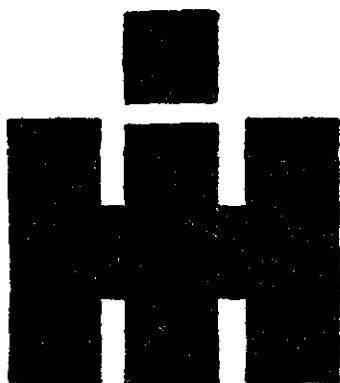

3 At no time during the term of the grant shall the plot or any portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any trade or business which has been or may be declared to be dangerous or offensive by notice in the Official Gazette

4 A veranda may be erected within the road reserve with the previous consent of the Local Authority and must conform to a building line decided upon by such authority

5 The annual cost of the maintenance of the roads when constructed will be paid in proportion to the frontage of each plot by the grantees of the plots

6 Should the grantees of the plots specified in the Schedule or the Local Authority at any time require the road to be constructed to a higher standard the costs of this construction will be paid in proportion to the frontage of the plots by the grantees
