**A BILL ENTITLED  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE RABIES  
ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Rabies (Amendment) Ordinance, 1953 and shall be read and construed as one with the Rabies Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the principal Ordinance is amended by deleting the definition of "proclaimed district" appearing therein and by inserting in its place a definition of "rabies control area" as follows—

"rabies control area" means any area which may be declared by the Director, by notice in the Gazette, to be a rabies control area for the purposes of this Ordinance

Provided that any area so declared shall cease to be a rabies control area on being declared by the Director, by notice in the Gazette, to be free from infection,

3. The principal Ordinance is further amended by substituting for the words "proclaimed district" wherever the same appear therein the words "rabies control area"

**MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS**

This Bill is designed to amend the Rabies Ordinance to enable the Director of Veterinary Services to declare areas to be "rabies control areas" for the purposes of the Ordinance with a view to applying to any such areas the necessary measures of control to free the same from infection with rabies. The present procedure is anomalous in that it provides for the application of the Ordinance by the Governor, by proclamation, to specified areas, whereas the Ordinance is in fact of general application throughout the Colony and only certain provisions of it are applicable only to areas so proclaimed. It is considered, moreover, that the Director of Veterinary Services is the appropriate authority to specify the areas in which rabies control measures are required.

Accordingly, the definition of "proclaimed district" is replaced by a definition of "rabies control area" whereby the function of notifying such areas is transferred to the Director of Veterinary Services, and the former phrase is replaced by the latter throughout the principal Ordinance.

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if this Bill is passed into law.

## VACANCIES IN UGANDA PROTECTORATE

*Supervisor of Clerical Training*

APPLICATIONS are invited from suitably qualified persons for appointment to the post of Supervisor of Clerical Training Secretariat Uganda on the following terms of service —

- (a) Salary scale £1,095 by £45 to £1,230. The initial salary will be determined in accordance with age, qualifications, experience and service including war service.
- (b) A temporary allowance at the rate of 30 per cent of the substantive salary (subject to a maximum of £300 per annum) will be paid.
- (c) The appointment will be on contract terms of service for a period of 30–36 months in the first instance. The selected candidate will be required to contribute to the Government Employees Provident Fund.
- (d) The appointment will be governed by the revised conditions of service for the Civil Services of Uganda.

The successful candidate will be required to visit offices in Uganda to instruct senior clerks in the control and guidance of their juniors, to advise on improved methods and office layout, to instruct clerks in the use of equipment and advise them on private study which may improve their effective educational standards, to investigate the need for additional clerical posts for which Departments may ask. He will also be required to administer a scheme for the interchange of personnel to enable clerks to be trained in the Secretariat. He will be based in Entebbe, but will spend a great deal of his time on safari in every part of the Protectorate in which district offices are situated.

Candidates should possess a wide experience of Government office management, routine and equipment with both up to date knowledge of current practice in United Kingdom Government offices and considerable experience in East Africa of such matters. Appreciation of, and sympathy with, the difficulties experienced by African clerks and the ability to deal with these and to raise their general standards of application and performance, are essential requirements.

Applications should be submitted to reach the Chief Secretary Entebbe, from whom application forms may be obtained, not later than 14th January 1953. Serving officers should submit applications through their heads of departments. Applicants residing in either Kenya or Tanganyika may obtain forms of application from the Chief Secretaries of the respective territories.

*Assistant Superintendent (Industries), Prison Department*

APPLICATIONS are invited from serving officers and others, between the age of 25 and 35 years, for appointment to the post of Assistant Superintendent (Industries), Prison Department on the following terms of service —

- (a) Salary scale £550 £550 £600 by £25 to £725 (Promotion Bar) £775 by £25 to £875 (Promotion Bar) by £30 to £1,025. The initial salary will be assessed in accordance with age, qualifications and experience and service including war service.

The duties of the post will consist in managing all prison industries i.e. tailoring, carpentry, blacksmithing and mat-making, supervising the training of prisoners employed on those industries and developing the industries section along the lines of modern efficiency with the assistance of instructors. Candidates should possess a strong sense of discipline, have tact and patience and should have served an apprenticeship at a recognized trade, preferably building or carpentry and joinery. Experience in running a workshop and controlling labour is an essential qualification.

Applications should be submitted to reach the Chief Secretary, Entebbe, from whom application forms may be obtained not later than 14th January 1953. Serving officers should submit applications through their heads of departments. Applicants residing in either Kenya or Tanganyika may obtain forms of application from the Chief Secretaries of the respective territories.

*Ginning Inspector Agriculture Department*

APPLICATIONS are invited for appointment to the post of Ginning Inspector, Agriculture Department on the following terms of service —

- (c) Appointment to the post which is a pensionable one, will be on probation for a period of two years in the first instance. Admission to the permanent and pensionable establishment will be subject to satisfactory service.
- (d) Contributions to the Widows and Orphans Pension Scheme will be compulsory.
- (e) The appointment will be governed by the revised conditions of service for the Civil Services of Uganda.

Applicants should have knowledge and experience of cotton ginning and the supervision of ginneries. The duties of the post will be concerned primarily with the inspection of cotton ginneries and their machinery and to supervise the standard of ginning of raw cotton in all its aspects. As ginneries are widely scattered throughout the Protectorate, frequent touring from headquarters will be required during the ginning season.

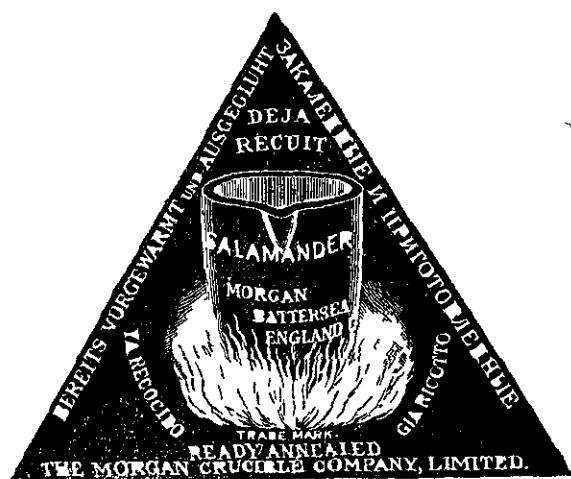

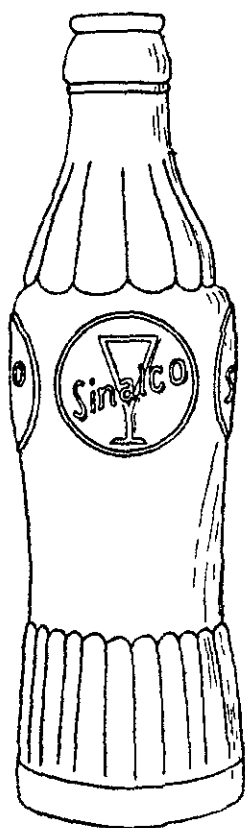

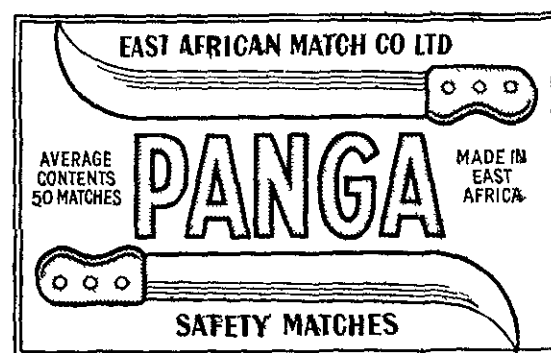
