**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PERSONAL TAX
ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title and
commencement.

Cap. 251.

Amendment of
section 3 of
the principal

Assessment of
tax.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Personal Tax (Amendment) Ordinance, 1953, and shall be read and construed as one with the Personal Tax Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance, and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of January, 1953. 5

2. Section 3 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting a colon for the full stop at the end of the section and by adding the following proviso—

Provided that any individual who—

(a) first arrives in the Colony; or 10

(b) having left the Colony before attaining the age of 18 years, returns to the Colony,

at any time after—

(i) the 30th June but prior to the 1st October in any year shall be exempt from the payment of one-half 15 of the tax payable under this section in respect of that year;

(ii) the 30th September in any year shall be exempt from the payment of the whole of the tax payable under this section in respect of that year. 20

3. The principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for section 4 thereof a new section as follows, and the said section 4 shall be deemed always to have had effect since the commencement of the principal Ordinance as if it had been enacted in the terms following— 25

4. The tax payable by an individual shall be assessed—

(a) in the case of an individual who is ordinarily resident in the Colony, by reference to the total income of such individual for the calendar year 30 immediately preceding the year in respect of which the tax is due;

(b) in the case of an individual whose ordinary place of residence is not in the Colony and who becomes liable to the tax in respect of any year, 35 under the provisions of this Ordinance, by reference to the total income which may reasonably be expected to accrue to such individual during that year;

(c) in the case of an individual who arrives for the 40 first time in the Colony with the intention of establishing his residence in the Colony, for the first and second years of such residence, by reference to the total income which may reasonably be expected to accrue to such individual 45 during such years respectively.

4. Sub-section (1) of section 16 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for paragraph (a) thereof a new paragraph as follows—

5 (a) any individual who has not attained the age of 18 years, or who, having attained the age of 18 years, is receiving full-time instruction at any university, college, school or other educational establishment or is serving under articles or indentures with a view to qualifying in a trade or profession:

10 Provided that, in respect of the year in which such individual attains the age of 18 years or, as the case may be, ceases to receive such instruction or to serve under such articles or indentures—

15 (i) if such attainment or cessation occurs before the 1st July, the individual shall pay the tax for that year at full rate;

(ii) if such attainment or cessation occurs after the 30th June but before the 1st October, the individual shall pay the tax for that year at half rate; and

20 (iii) if such attainment or cessation occurs on or after the 1st October, the individual shall not be liable to pay the tax for that year.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill is designed to effect certain amendments to the Personal Tax Ordinance.

When a person first comes to the Colony after half of the year has elapsed it is considered that the requirement of the Personal Tax Ordinance (Cap. 251) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance) that he shall pay the same amount of tax as he would have been liable to pay had he arrived on the 1st January is inequitable.

Clause 2 of the Bill will accordingly amend section 3 of the principal Ordinance to exempt from half of the tax to which under the section he is liable any person who first arrived in the Colony after the 30th June and to exempt altogether from payment of the tax any person who arrived after the 30th September.

It has hitherto been understood, and the principal Ordinance has been operated on the understanding, that personal tax is chargeable under paragraph (a) of section 3 of the principal Ordinance whatever the tax-payer's income may be within the range *nil* to £60. In view of the mandatory wording of section 4, however, which renders the tax exigible from income, this construction of the Ordinance may be misconceived, and the better interpretation may be that personal tax is a specific levy on income and cannot be exacted otherwise than from income. In order to place the matter beyond doubt Clause 3 of the Bill proposes to substitute a new section 4 of the principal Ordinance so worded as to provide, as was the original intention, that the income of the tax-payer is relevant only as a yardstick for calculating the appropriate tax payable. In order to avoid reopening past assessments, the new and unambiguous wording of section 4 of the principal Ordinance is related to the operation of the Ordinance during previous years.

The amendment proposed by Clause 4 of the Bill is designed to exempt students from liability to personal tax and to apply to students and to other persons on attaining the age of 18 years in any year (persons under the age of 18 being exempted from liability to the tax) the same principles as are by clause 2 of the Bill applied to persons arriving in the Colony in the course of the year. Thus, persons attaining the age of 18, or ceasing to be students, in the third quarter of a year will be liable to tax for that year at half-rate and persons attaining the age of 18, or ceasing to be students, in the fourth quarter of any year will be exempted from payment of the tax for that year.

It is not possible to estimate accurately the extent of the loss to revenue which will result from these amendments but it is not expected to be very great.

**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ESTATE DUTY
ORDINANCE**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title
and
commencement.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1953, and shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of January, 1953.

(2) This Ordinance shall be read and construed as one with the Estate Duty Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.

Amendment of

2. Section 11 of the principal Ordinance is amended by adding thereto a proviso as follows—

Provided that the first £5,000 of any estate the principal value of which exceeds that amount shall, without prejudice to the rate of estate duty applicable in the case of such estate according to the Schedule to this Ordinance, be exempt from estate duty.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

By virtue of the provisions of the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1952, estates not exceeding £5,000 in value are exempt from the payment of estate duty. This concession, however, falls short of that foreshadowed by the Member for Finance in presenting the 1953 Budget in that the first £5,000 of larger estates is not exempt from estate duty. This Bill accordingly extends the concession to cover the first £5,000 of larger estates.

The loss to revenue which will result if this Bill becomes law cannot be precisely estimated but will not be very great, and due allowance has been made therefor in the 1953 Estimates.

(a) General Conditions

The term of the grants will be 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

(iv) The application for any plot shall be deemed to be upon and subject to the conditions herein contained and the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and in particular Part VII thereof.

(b) Special Conditions

(i) The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 24 months of the date of the commencement of the term a building of approved design on proper foundations constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete with roofing of tiles or other permanent materials approved by the Commissioner of Lands and shall maintain the same in good and substantial tenable repair and condition, including the external paintwork, during the continuance of the term.

(ii) No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been approved by the Local Authority and by the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Kisumu, within three months of the date of the commencement of the term.

(iii) In the event of the grantee failing to comply with any condition herein contained, any proceedings that may be

necessary will forthwith be instituted for the recovery of the land. Moneys that may have been paid in respect of the plot will be forfeited to the Crown.

(iv) No buildings erected on the said land may be occupied until the grantee shall have submitted a block plan with the position of such buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage for disposing of surface and sullage water on the said land to a soakage pit to the satisfaction of the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands, and the grantee shall also satisfy the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands that such system of drainage has been properly constructed, such satisfaction to be expressed in writing.

(v) The grantee shall, at his own expense, duly and suitably connect such drainage system with any town drainage system when, in the opinion of the Local Authority, the latter system is so far completed as to enable the grantee reasonably so to do.

(vi) Any building erected on the plot shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Local Authority.

(vii) The grantee shall not sell or transfer the plot nor enter into any mortgage charge (other than with the consent of the Commissioner of Lands for the raising of a loan for building purposes, or agreement for sale in respect thereof within ten years of the date of the commencement of the term.
