**A BILL ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE WILD ANIMALS
PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1951**

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Wild Animals Protection (Amendment) Ordinance, 1953, and shall be read and construed as one with the Wild Animals Protection Ordinance, 1951, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance. Short title.
No. 18 of 1951.
2. Paragraph (b) of sub-section (5) of section 7 of the principal Ordinance is amended by inserting next after the words "in contravention of" the commas and words ", or fails to comply with,". Amendment of section 7 of the principal Ordinance.
- 10 3. Section 13 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for sub-sections (1) and (2) thereof the following sub-section— Amendment of section 13 of the principal Ordinance.
- 15 (1) Subject to the provisions of this section and of section 4 of this Ordinance, and to any directions issued by the Member under section 56 of this Ordinance, a licensing officer may, in respect of any of the animals specified in the first column of the Fourth Schedule to this Ordinance, in his discretion grant to the holder of a full licence, on payment of the appropriate fee specified in the third column of the said Schedule, a special licence:

- Provided that—
- (i) during the period of validity of any one full licence no special licence shall be granted in respect of more animals than the number respectively specified in the second column of the said Schedule in relation to each type of animal;
- 25
- (ii) a licensing officer may, without assigning any reason therefor, refuse to grant a special licence. Amendment to section 23 of the principal Ordinance.
- 30 4. Sub-section (1) of section 23 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting for paragraph (b) of the proviso thereto the following paragraph—
- (b) any animal killed on private land, other than an animal specified in the Second or Fourth Schedule to this Ordinance. Amendment of section 32 of the principal Ordinance.

5. Section 32 of the principal Ordinance is amended as follows—
- (a) by deleting the words from the beginning of sub-section (2) thereof to the words "and if—" in that sub-section, and by substituting therefor the words "For the purposes of this section a game animal or trophy or meat shall be deemed to have been obtained by any person in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance either if it was purchased

by such person in accordance with the provisions of section 33 of this Ordinance, or if no offence against this Ordinance or any Ordinance hereby repealed has been committed in relation to the animal, trophy or meat and—”;

(b) by deleting paragraph (d) of sub-section (2) thereof;

(c) by inserting next after sub-section (5) thereof the following new sub-section—

(6) Whenever any person is charged with being in possession of any game animal, trophy, or the meat of a game animal obtained in contravention of this Ordinance, and proof is given of possession, the onus shall be upon the person charged to prove that such animal, trophy or meat was lawfully obtained.

6. There shall be inserted, next after section 41 of the principal Ordinance, the following new section—

41A. (1) For the more effective carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance a competent officer, or a subordinate officer authorized by him in that behalf, may erect a temporary barrier across any road or public place.

(2) Every person approaching such a barrier shall, on being required by such officer to do, stop before reaching it, and shall allow such officer to carry out such search, including the inspection of any vehicle, as may appear to such officer to be necessary or expedient.

(3) Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section, or with any reasonable order given in pursuance thereof, or with any reasonable signal requiring such person to stop as aforesaid, shall be guilty of an offence.

7. There shall be substituted for the Fourth Schedule to the principal Ordinance the following Schedule—

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Since the coming into force of the Wild Animals Protection Ordinance, 1951, which makes provision for the preservation and control of wild animals in the Colony, a number of weaknesses have become apparent which this Bill seeks to remove.

Section 7 (3) of the Ordinance empowers a Game Warden, when issuing a permit to hunt in a controlled area, to attach conditions to the permit if he thinks fit, but the section does not make it an offence to fail to comply with such conditions. This is remedied by *clause 2* of the Bill.

Clauses 3 and 7

The Member for Agriculture and Natural Resources is empowered, by section 57 (1) (a) of the Ordinance, to amend the 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th Schedules and may therefore add the name of any animal to Part I of the 4th Schedule (which specifies those animals which may be killed on Special Licence only) and insert in Part II thereof the fee payable for the Special Licence required to shoot it.

However, section 13 (2) of the Ordinance contains a list of the maximum number of special licences which may be granted to one person during the validity of a full licence; as this is part of the Ordinance proper any alteration to this list which may be necessary from time to time can only be effected by amendment to the Ordinance. *Clause 3* of the Bill transfers the list to the 4th Schedule, so as to give the Member power to amend the list of animals to be shot on Special Licence only. The existing parts of the Schedule, together with the additional data now transferred, have been redrafted to group them together in tabular form, in order that the Schedule may be more readily understood. (*Clause 7.*)

Clause 4

The wording of paragraph (b) of the proviso to section 23, owing to the omission of a comma, gives a meaning directly opposite to that intended. This clause rewords the proviso in unambiguous terms.

Clause 5

The wording of the preamble to sub-section (2) of section 32 of the Ordinance has the effect of prohibiting the possession of game or trophies in respect of which an offence has at some time been committed. This wording goes too far since it renders unlawful the possession of game or trophies properly sold in accordance with section 33 (for example, confiscated trophies later sold by Government). *Clause 5* removes the restriction by rewording the preamble to section 32 (2) and by deleting paragraph (d).

Clause 5 also adds a new sub-section to section 32 of the Ordinance, placing on a person charged with illegal possession of a game animal, trophy or game meat the onus of proving that it was lawfully obtained. This provision is considered essential if the trade in game trophies, especially ivory and rhinoceros horn, is to be adequately controlled, and its omission involves loss of revenue by depriving Government of a large number of valuable trophies properly belonging to the Crown. The principle of shifting the onus of proof in such cases is recognized in the legislation of other territories.

Clause 6 adds a new section 41A to the Ordinance empowering officers of the Game Department to erect road barriers for inspection purposes in order more effectively to administer the Ordinance.

No additional expenditure of public moneys will be incurred if the provisions of this Bill become law.



- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of seven days as required by Condition (a) (1) below, the Commissioner of Lands shall declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

Applications *must not* be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.

(a) General Conditions

1. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within seven days of notification that his application has been approved the assessed stand premium and the initial estimated roads and drains contribution in respect of the plot, together with the survey fees, the proportionate annual rent payable in advance for 1953, the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent on the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time the purchaser shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

2. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.

(b) Conditions of Grant

1. The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within twenty-four months of the date of the commencement of the term a building of approved design, on proper foundations constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete with roofing of tiles or other permanent materials approved by the Commissioner of Lands and shall maintain the same in good and substantial tenantable repair and condition, including the external paint-work, during the continuance of the term.

2. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been approved by the Local Authority and by the Commissioner of Lands, or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans, etc., shall be submitted in triplicate to the District Commissioner, Nanyuki, within three months of the date of the commencement of the term.

3. In the event of the grantee failing to comply with any condition herein contained, any proceedings that may be necessary will forthwith be instituted for the recovery of the land. Moneys that may have been paid in respect of the plot will be forfeited to the Crown.

4. No buildings erected on the said land may be occupied until the grantee shall have submitted a block plan with the position of such buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage for disposing of surface and sullage water on the said land and also for disposing of sewage by water-borne carriage to a septic tank and soakage pit in each case to the satisfaction of the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands, and the grantee shall also satisfy the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands that such systems of drainage have been properly constructed, such satisfaction in both cases to be expressed in writing.

6. Grants will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grants will be 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.

7. At no time during the term of the grant shall more than one private dwelling-house with necessary offices and out-buildings be erected on the plot. The erection or use of more than one kitchen shall be deemed to be a breach of this condition.

15. 16. 17.
