TENDERS in terms of proposals for development are invited for the leasehold of portions of an area of approximately 12 acres of land in the vicinity of Anderson Road for the purpose of constructing residential accommodation in the form of flats.

3. Survey will be undertaken as soon as the information in regard to the areas to be granted is available.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

(a) Tenders

1. Sealed envelopes marked "Tenders for Anderson Road" must be deposited with the undersigned before noon on the 30th day of June, 1953.

2. It has been decided that the density of building shall be at the rate of 16,000 square feet of accommodation per acre (exclusive of servants' quarters), in multi-storeyed buildings. In the same area a considerable amount of space has been provided for the purpose of building official housing.

3. The public is invited to tender for areas of this land in terms of development proposals. Tenders should take the form of application to build a stated number of square feet of residential flat accommodation, the minimum being 16,000 square feet. Each tender should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

- (a) the amount of capital it is proposed to spend on the project, with a banker's letter in support;
- (b) the amount of accommodation it is proposed to build, i.e. 16,000 square feet or any larger amount not necessarily in complete additional units of 16,000 square feet;
- (c) the scale of accommodation per flat; separate scales to be given for each type designed;
- (d) the method by which the flats will be made available to the public, together with a statement of terms and conditions appropriate to the method of making available, e.g. rent, tenant purchase terms and conditions—if proposed—outright purchase by tenants, etc.

4. Tenders should also include a description of the provision for car parking, servants' quarters, etc. All successful tenderers will be required to conform in all respects with the City by-laws for accommodation of this sort, together with the terms and conditions set out in the Schedule hereto.

5. The area will be developed under the guidance of the City Council and the Commissioner in a harmonious integrated manner. Sketch plans should, therefore, not be submitted but tenderers should state the name of the architect they propose to employ; tenderers or their architects will later be required to consult together with the City Council and the Commissioner in order to achieve a harmonious development. In this development, particular attention will be paid to the treatment of the land adjoining the proposed Processional Way. Building plans not in accordance with the above will not be approved. In the siting of buildings and the provision of amenity areas, regard will be had to the requirements of the overall development of the area.

6. Grants of land will be made proportionate to the amount of accommodation which it is proposed to erect on the basis of one acre per 16,000 square feet of accommodation. As the amount of land is limited, it may be necessary to scale down tenderers' proposals. Particular regard will be had to economy in the use of land and the provision of amenities. A plan illustrating in general outline the type of development required may be had on application to the Commissioner, price Sh. 3.

7. Successful tenderers will be required to pay within 14 days of notification that their tender, or such notification of it as may be agreed, has been accepted, the full amount of stand premium due and annual rent until 31st December, 1953.

(b) General

1. Grants will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grant will be 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of approval of the grant.

2. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

3. The grantee shall erect complete for use and occupation within three years of the date of commencement of the term of the grant an approved building in accordance with the terms of the successful tender, of a design, including block plans, showing the position of the buildings, drawings and elevations, previously approved by the Commissioner of Lands and the City Council and shall maintain the same, including the external paintwork, in good and substantial repair and condition during the continuance of the term of the grant. The grantee will be required to conform with the City by-laws in all respects. All buildings in the area will be required to conform to a general architectural plan and the successful tenderers or their architects will be required to consult with the City Council before submitting plans. Successful tenderers will be informed when letters of allotment are issued as to the place and time at which such consultation shall be held.

4. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublease, charge or otherwise alienate or part with possession of the plot without the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands and such consent will not be given if the building prescribed by Condition No. 3 aforesaid has not been completed to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

Provided, nevertheless, that the plot may with the prior consent in writing to the Commissioner of Lands be charged for the purpose of securing the repayment of any sum which the Commissioner may be satisfied is required by the grantee to enable him to fulfil his obligations under Condition No. 3 aforesaid.

5. The grantee shall be required to pay all rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be charged, assessed, levied or imposed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the Government in lieu thereof.

6. The cost of the construction of roads, drains and sewers to serve the plot shall be payable by the grantee on demand.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. The premises may be used for the purposes of residential flats only and for no other purpose whatsoever.
