Every successful applicant (herein after referred to as the grantee) shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the survey fees, the stand premium, the estimated cost of roads and drains, proportion of rent for 1953 as set out in the Schedule and stamp duty, which is approximately 2 per cent of the purchase price and annual rent. In default of payment within the specified period the allocation may be cancelled and the grantee shall have no further claim to the plot.
- 7. The grantee shall be responsible for the estimated proportionate cost of sewers and will be required to pay the same within 14 days of demand therefor. Failure to comply with this requirement will entail forfeiture of all rights to the plot and any moneys that have been paid in respect of the plot will be forfeited to the Crown.
 - 8. The grant will be issued only in the name of the person by whom the application is made.

Conditions of Grant

- 1. The grant will be for a term of 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of approval of the grant and will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya) and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance.
- 2. The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 24 months of the commencement of the term an approved building constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations, with roofing of tiles or other permanent materials and maintain the same in good and substantial tenantable repair and condition both inside and outside, including paint work, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands and the City Council of Nairobi during the continuance of the term.
- 3. No building shall be erected until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage for the disposal of surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, in the first instance within three months of the commencement of the term.
- 4. If the foregoing provisions of Conditions 2 and 3 are not carried out, proceedings will be instituted for the recovery of the land and any moneys that may have been paid in respect of the plot will be forfeited to the Crown.
- 5. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telegraph and telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee

shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any alignments of mains or service pipes and drains, or telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

- 6. The grantee shall not sell or transfer the plot nor enter into any mortgage charge or agreement to sell in respect of the plot, unless the consent of the Commissioner of Lands in writing has been previously obtained.
 - 7. The grantee shall not subdivide the plot.
- 8. The grantee shall pay such taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be charged, assessed, levied or imposed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the Government in lieu thereof.
