- (d) The amount of capital available for immediate development of the plot.

Applicants should, therefore, refer to all these matters and their applications should be accompanied by a banker's reference, indicating that the proposed capital expenditure is likely to be available. Applicants should also refer to any previous correspondence with the Commissioner in connexion with such plots. In cases where the applicant is carrying on light industrial business elsewhere, indication should also be given to the present locality of any enterprise which it is proposed to transfer to the new Light Industrial Area. This description of the present location should be sufficient to enable the present locality of the enterprise to be identified and, if necessary, inspected.

5. Applications must be deposited with the Special Commissioner and Acting Commissioner not later than noon on 30th June, 1953.

6. Every successful applicant (herein after referred to as the grantee) shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the survey fees, the stand premium, the estimated cost of roads and drains, proportion of rent for 1953 as set out in the Schedule and stamp duty, which is approximately 2 per cent of the purchase price and annual rent. In default of payment within the specified period the allocation may be cancelled and the grantee shall have no further claim to the plot.

7. The grantee shall be responsible for the estimated proportionate cost of sewers and will be required to pay the same within 14 days of demand therefor. The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 24 months of the commencement of the term an approved building constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete on proper foundations, with roofing of tiles or other permanent materials and maintain the same in good and substantial tenable repair and condition both inside and outside, including paint work, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands and the City Council of Nairobi during the continuance of the term.

3. No building shall be erected until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage for the disposal of surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously approved by the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint. Such plans shall be submitted in triplicate to the Town Clerk, Nairobi, in the first instance within three months of the commencement of the term.

4. If the foregoing provisions of Conditions 2 and 3 are not carried out, proceedings will be instituted for the recovery of the land and any moneys that may have been paid in respect of the plot will be forfeited to the Crown.

5. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telegraph and telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee
