VACANCIES IN KENYA GOVERNMENT

Senior Inspector of Works, Hydraulic Branch, Public Works Department

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Senior Inspector of Works, Hydraulic Branch, Public Works Department, on the salary scale £740 by £25 to £840 per annum.

Applications should be sent to the Secretary, European Civil Service Advisory Board, P.O. Box 621, Nairobi, so as to reach him not later than the 31st July, 1953.

In addition to salary a temporary non-pensionable cost of living allowance is payable at the current rate of 30 per cent of salary, subject to a maximum of £300 per annum.

Applicants in Government Service should submit their applications in accordance with the procedure laid down in Secretariat Circular No. 30 of 29th September, 1944. Applications from candidates not in the Government Service should be submitted on the form of application for employment with the Government of Kenya, copies of which can be obtained from the Secretary, European Civil Service Advisory Board, Nairobi. It is preferable that only copies of testimonials should be sent in the first instance.

The posts are permanent and pensionable and the general terms and conditions of service are as follows:—

- For applicants not already in the Government Service appointment on probation for two years before admission to the permanent and pensionable establishment.
- Eighteen days' local leave per annum; and vacation leave at the rate of 4½ days for each completed month of residential service after 48 months' tour for officers under 40 and at the rate of 5½ days for each completed month of residential service after 40 months' tour for officers over 40.
- Free passages to the United Kingdom for the officer (and for his wife, if he is married) after completion of a tour of service, and return passages if returning for further service; in the case of a married officer with dependant children under 21, passages for himself and his family are provided up to the cost of three adult passages or the actual cost of the passages whichever is the less.
- When in occupation of Government quarters 10 per cent of salary is charged as rent if the quarters are furnished and 7½ per cent. of salary if they are unfurnished; when an officer occupies private quarters, he may claim an allowance up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 10 per cent of his salary if the quarters are furnished, and up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 7½ per cent of his salary if they are unfurnished.
- Free medical treatment by the Government Medical Service for the officer, his wife and dependant unmarried children under 21 years of age.

Duties and Qualifications

The applicant should have a sound knowledge of mechanical work, and should be competent to inspect and report on all types of mechanical plant in connexion with water supply installations in the Colony. In particular he must have a thorough knowledge of the installation, maintenance and operation of small diesel engines, and surface and borehole pumps, including electrically-driven submersible pumping units. He must be fully conversant with drilling and testing of boreholes carried out by contracts.

A working knowledge of the principle of water treatment and of the plant normally in use in the Colony is essential, as well as administrative experience and a knowledge of accounting procedure.

The candidate appointed may be stationed anywhere in the Colony, and will be required to undertake safaris.

Temporary Clerks (Stenographers), Kenya Police

APPLICATIONS are invited for the posts of Temporary European Female Clerks (Stenographers) in the Kenya Police, Nairobi.

The salary attached to the posts is:—

- (a) £480 by £15 to £540 provided candidates have passed the Government Senior Examination in Shorthand and Typing (which require a shorthand speed of 110 words a minute for five minutes and a typing speed of 50 words a minute for ten minutes) or can produce documentary evidence of having passed examinations of an equivalent standard (i.e. Pitman's, the London Chamber of Commerce and the Royal Society of Arts) and have had at least five years' experience after the age of 18.
- (b) Candidates not possessing the qualifications set out in (a) above would be appointed on the scale £295 by £15 to £460 per annum in accordance with age and previous experience.
- (c) Cost of living allowance of 30 per cent of basic salary is at present payable.

The terms and conditions of service are as under—

Eighteen working days local leave per annum; free medical attention; 2½ days' leave for every completed month of service, to be taken on termination of appointment.

The place of duty is at the Headquarters, the Kenya Police, Machakos Road, Nairobi, and the duties of the post will be shorthand and typing.

6. The grantee shall, at his own expense, duly and suitably connect such sewage and drainage system with any town sewage and drainage system when, in the opinion of the Local Authority, the latter system is so far completed as to enable the grantee reasonably so to do.

7. Any building erected on the plot shall conform to a building line decided upon by the Local Authority.

8. The grantee shall not sell or transfer the plot nor enter into any mortgage charge (other than with the consent of the Commissioner of Lands for the raising of a loan for building purposes) or agreement for sale in respect thereof until Special Condition No. 1 has been complied with.

9. Subject to Special Condition No. 7 the grantee shall not at any time during the continuance of the term of the grant subdivide the land or assign, sub-let or otherwise dispose of any portion without prior consent in writing of the Governor.

10. All out-buildings, offices, etc., shall be properly sited and screened from view to the satisfaction of the Local Authority or such person as may be appointed for the purpose and shall be kept so screened during the continuance of the grant.

11. The Government or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains, sewers, pipes and drains, telegraph and telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignment of mains, sewers or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

12. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or out-goings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or building erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the Government in lieu thereof.

13. The application for any plot shall be deemed to be upon and subject to the conditions herein contained and the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya).

14. The grantee shall, as aforementioned, make an initial payment for the estimated amount for the cost of construction of roads and drains as shown in the Schedules hereto. On completion of the construction of roads and drains and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate amount payable in respect of each plot, the grantee shall either pay (within seven days of demand therefor) or be refunded the amount by which the actual cost exceeds or falls short of the amount previously paid on account as the case may be.

15. The annual cost of the maintenance of the roads when constructed will be paid by the grantee in such proportion as the Commissioner of Lands may determine.

16. Should the grantees of the plots specified herein or the Local Authority at any time require the roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the cost of this construction will be paid by the said grantees in the proportions determined by the Commissioner of Lands.

(c) Additional Special Conditions Applicable to the Plots in Schedule I

1. The plots shall be used for residential purposes only and for no other purpose whatsoever.

2. The grantee shall not at any time during the term of the grant erect any buildings so as to cover more than 50 per cent of the area of the plot.

(d) Additional Special Conditions in Respect of the Business-cum-residential Plots in Schedule II

1. The grantee shall use and permit to be used the land hereby granted for business purposes only, excepting trades which in the opinion of the Commissioner of Lands are dangerous or offensive but shall be at liberty to use the said land for the combined purpose of business and residence notwithstanding, provided that in the event of the said land being used for the said combined purpose, then not more than one-half of the area hereof shall be built upon or if for business purposes only then not more than 90 per cent shall be built upon.

2. A veranda may be erected within the road reserve with the previous consent of the Local Authority and must conform to a building line decided upon by such Authority.
