Applicants are requested to state clearly in their applications for which type of grant they wish to apply (i.e. the 15 or 99 years' lease).

The sea frontages of the plots have been demarcated with posts and numbered iron plates, but no official survey has yet been made and the acreages shown in the Schedule are only approximate.

The stand premium (if payable) and the annual rent payable in respect of each plot will be subject to adjustment when the precise areas have been ascertained. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.

Grants will be subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155) and titles will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance (Cap. 160).

Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands, within 14 days of notification by him that an application has been approved, the survey fees, the assessed stand premium, where applicable, the proportion of annual rent and the roads and drain charges as specified in the Schedule below, as well as the fees in respect of the preparation of the grant (Sh. 120).

- 7. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 8. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sub-let or charge the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Governor; no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition (i) in the case of grants for 15 years and Special Condition No. (i) in the case of grants for 99 years have been performed.
- 9. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by Government in lieu thereof.

#### (a) Special Conditions—15-Year Leases

- (i) The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 18 months of the date of the commencement of the term of the grant a building of approved design on proper foundations with a minimum construction of coral rag with *makuti* roof.
