VACANCIES IN KENYA GOVERNMENT

Audit Clerk (European), Department of Local Government

APPLICATIONS are invited for the post of Audit Clerk in the Department of Local Government. They should be sent to the Commissioner for Local Government, P.O. Box 831, Nairobi, to reach him not later than 4th October, 1953.

The salary scale of the post is £250 per annum whilst under 20 years of age, thereafter £295 by £22.10 to £407.10 (Efficiency Bar) by £22.10 to £565. In addition to salary a temporary non-pensionable cost of living allowance is payable (at present 30 per cent of basic salary).

Applicants in Government service should submit their applications through the head of their department. Applications from candidates not in the Government service should be submitted on the form of application for employment with the Government of Kenya, copies of which can be obtained from the territory in which the applicant resides. It is preferable that only copies of testimonials should be sent in the first instance.

The posts are permanent and pensionable and the general terms and conditions of service are as follows:—

- (c) Free passages to the United Kingdom for the officer (and for his wife, if he is married) after completion of a tour of service, and return passages if returning for further service; in the case of a married officer with dependent children under 21, passages for himself and his family are provided up to the cost of three adult passages or the actual cost of the passages, whichever is the less.
- (d) When in occupation of Government quarters 10 per cent of salary is charged as rent if the quarters are furnished and $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent if they are unfurnished; when an officer occupies private quarters, he may claim an allowance up to the amount by which the rent exceeds 10 per cent of his salary if the quarters are furnished, and up to the amount by which the rent exceeds $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of his salary if they are unfurnished.
- (e) Free medical treatment by the Government Medical Service for the officer, his wife and dependent unmarried children under 21.

Duties and Qualifications

The duties of the post are to assist the Local Government Inspector and the Assistant Local Government Inspectors in the work of auditing the accounts of Municipalities, European County and District Councils, certain Townships and African District Councils.

Candidates should be under 30 years of age and possess either accounting or audit experience. They must be prepared to travel in the Colony and be absent from headquarters several months of the year. Preference will be given to candidates who are prepared to undertake a course of study with a view to obtaining professional qualifications.

Salary scale: £670 by £20 to £690 by £25 to £790. Cost of living allowance at current rates.

Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot where specified, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees, the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately two per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

1. The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 24 months of the commencement of the term buildings of approved design on proper foundations constructed of stone burnt-brick or concrete with roofing of tiles or other permanent materials approved by the Commissioner of Lands and shall maintain the same (including the external paintwork) in good and substantial tenable repair and condition.

2. The buildings shall not be erected until plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for disposing of sewage, surface and sullage water on the land), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been approved in writing by the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands. Such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications shall be submitted in triplicate to the Local Authority within three months of the commencement of the term.

3. The land and buildings shall only be used for residential purposes.

4. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land.

5. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.

6. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

7. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sub-let or charge the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Governor; no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 1 has been performed.

8. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land.

9. The grantee, having paid the estimated proportionate cost of constructing roads and drains to serve the land, shall, on

completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost, either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

10. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

11. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

12. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the Governor in lieu thereof.

13. The Governor or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.
