MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

It is desirable in the improvement of the African information and education services to encourage facilities for the reception of radio broadcasting by every means. The Bill therefore removes any hindrance arising from customs duties to the importation and sale at reduced prices of inexpensive wireless receivers. The concession cannot conveniently be extended to spare parts and batteries, but the existing concessions to privileged users of wireless transmission are retained.

If the provisions of this Bill become law some loss of revenue will result, the extent of which it is not possible to estimate.

In the event of the licensee not obtaining a grant of 15,000acre block or blocks owing to non-compliance with the provisions of Condition No. 4 (a) and (b) above, he shall be at liberty, on the expiration of the licence by efflux of time, to remove any machinery or any structures of a temporary nature which may have been brought on to the land or erected and constructed by him for the purposes of the said licence, making good all damage done and leaving the land in a clean and tidy condition to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands or such person as he may appoint. Provided that in the event of the sinking of a successful borehole which, in the opinion of the Government Hydraulic Engineer yields potable water, the Government shall have first option to purchase the same at a valuation. If any difference of opinion shall arise as to the valuation aforesaid, the matter shall be referred to arbitration under the provisions of the Arbitration Ordinance (Cap. 22, the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya).
- 6. The boundaries of the block or blocks up to a total of 15,000 acres when selected by the licensee shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Lands, in order to ensure that the land is not selected in such a manner as to render the remainder an uneconomic unit.

Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within fourteen days of notification that his application has been approved, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees, the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 120) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent).
