A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE INCOME TAX (RATES AND ALLOWANCES) ORDINANCE, 1952

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Income Tax short title and (Rates and Allowances) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1953, and shall be read and construed as one with the Income Tax (Rates and Allowances) Ordinance, 1952, hereinafter referred No. 33 of 1952. 5 to as the principal Ordinance.

- (2) The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 2 of the principal Ordinance shall apply to the principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance.
- 2. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into Commencement 10 operation on the 1st day of January, 1952, and accordingly to have and to have had effect for determining the chargeable income of any non-resident individual for any year of income commencing on or after the 1st day of January, 1952.

3. The First Schedule to the principal Ordinance is Amendment of 15 amended in the following respects—

Schedule to the principal Ordinance.

- (a) in the paragraph relating to non-resident primary allowance set forth in relation to section 34 (2) of the principal Act, by substituting—
 - (i) for the figure of £160 (single allowance) the figure of £180:
 - (ii) for the figure of £245 (married allowance) the figure of £280;
 - (iii) for the figure of £60 (child's allowance) the figure of £85;

(iv) for the fraction of one-fifth (second child's allowance) the fraction of two-ninths;

(b) in the paragraph relating to the non-resident secondary allowance set forth in relation to section 34 (3) of the principal Act, by substituting—

(i) for the figure of £100 (single allowance) the figure of £115;

- (ii) for the figure of £155 (married allowance) the figure of £180;
- (iii) for the figure of £40 (child's allowance) the figure of £55.

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

Since 1940 the East African Governments have agreed that nonresidents living in the United Kingdom who are liable to East African income tax should not be charged more than the amount which is charged by the United Kingdom Government to residents in the United Kingdom on the same income. On various occasions the Income Tax (Non-Residents' Allowances) Rules made under the original Income Tax Ordinance (Cap. 254) were amended to ensure that as a result of changes in the rates of tax and allowances in the United Kingdom, non-residents liable to East African tax should not be charged more than the amount chargeable under the United Kingdom legislation.

- 2. The 1952 United Kingdom Finance Act increased the personal allowances and reduced the initial rates of tax and hence the revision of the East African non-resident allowances is necessary because the concessions made in the United Kingdom mean that the East African tax payable by non-residents living in the United Kingdom will exceed the United Kingdom tax at certain income levels. The most convenient way of ensuring that non-resident East African taxpayers are not required to bear a greater burden than the United Kingdom residents on the same income is to amend the non-resident primary allowances.
- 3. In order to maintain parity between non-residents living in the United Kingdom and non-residents living elsewhere overseas, the non-resident secondary allowances must also be revised.
- 4. This Bill is designed to amend the Schedule to the Income Tax (Rates and Allowances) Ordinance, 1952 (No. 33 of 1952), to give effect to the revisions of the non-resident primary and secondary allowances mentioned in paragraphs 2 and 3 above. Similar legislation will be enacted in the other East African territories.
- 5. If the provisions of this Bill become law, they will involve a loss of revenue at a rate which is unlikely to exceed £1,000 per annum applying to the years of income commencing on or after 1st January, 1952.


