APPLICATIONS have already been called for in respect of some of the above plots in terms of General Notice No. 1786 of the 18th August, 1953. At that time 24 plots were advertised but as the number of applications in response to that Notice greatly exceeded the number of plots, it has been decided to make available for alienation to the Public a further 25 seafront plots adjoining those already advertised and extending to the Mida Creek.

Those persons who submitted applications under the previous General Notice should not re-apply. Their applications will be considered together with new applications under this Notice, as it is intended that the total number of plots in the scheme and all applications therefor should be considered as a whole. (a) Special Conditions—15-Year Leases

(i) The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 18 months of the date of the commencement of the term of the grant a building of approved design on proper foundations with a minimum construction of coral rag with makuti roof.
