A BILL ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE LAW SOCIETY OF KENYA ORDINANCE, 1949

ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Law Society of short title. Kenya (Amendment) Ordinance, 1953, and shall be read and construed as one with the Law Society of Kenya Ordinance, No. 10 of 1949. 1949, hereinafter referred to as the principal Ordinance.
- 2. Section 25 of the principal Ordinance is amended by Amendment of deleting therefrom the words "the 30th day of June and", and section 25 of the principal by adding at the end thereof the words "The audited accounts Ordinance." shall be presented by the Council to the General Meeting convened, in accordance with the provisions of section 17 of 10 this Ordinance, within six weeks after the 31st day of December in each year.".

This Bill amends the Law Society of Kenya Ordinance, 1949, by providing for an annual audit of the Society's accounts instead of the semi-annual audit which the Ordinance at present requires. 




