(Part of L.R. No. 209/4336—Bishop's Road)

THE Commissioner of Lands gives notice that applications are invited in the terms of proposals for the development of the above-mentioned site, situated in Bishop's Road, for the purposes of an hotel in accordance with the conditions set out below. Attention is particularly drawn to the concessional nature of the rent to be charged.

Conditions of Sale

1. Sealed envelopes marked "Application for Hotel Site" should be deposited with the Commissioner of Lands, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, before noon on the 9th January, 1960. Any correspondence other than the tender itself should not be marked in this way as applications will not be opened until the closing date.

2. Plans of the site may be inspected in the Department of Lands, Nairobi, or copies may be obtained from the Director of Surveys, P.O. Box 30046, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 6 per copy.

3. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

(a) the outline proposals of the applicant for the development of the site, including the name of the consultant to be employed on the erection of the building and the purposes for which he is to be employed. No sketch plan is required, but the successful tenderer will be asked to submit for approval a sketch plan of the building he proposes to erect before proceeding to detailed drawings. The outline proposals should include—

(i) a site layout plan in sufficient detail to show the following—

- (a) siting of the buildings in relation to the boundaries of the plot;
- (b) access and egress from the plot;
- (c) car parking areas;
- (d) ancillary buildings (e.g. servants' quarters etc.);

(ii) an indication of the number of bedrooms and other rooms to be constructed; this accommodation to be complete and ready for occupation within thirty-six months of the commencement of the term of the grant. Applicants may, if they wish, indicate their plans for subsequent additional development;

(iii) the proposed tariff of the various types of accommodation to be offered, together with a description of the accommodation offered which should include the ratio of bedrooms to bathrooms;

(iv) the number and nature of public rooms to be provided;

(b) the amount of capital available for immediate development, which must be not less than Sh. 1,500,000 (£75,000), together with a statement from the applicant's bankers, or from the representative of some other financial institution acceptable to the Commissioner, certifying that this amount is either immediately available, or will become available during the course of the construction of the hotel;

(c) applicants are advised to acquaint themselves with the Local Authority's requirements before submitting tenders.

4. The successful applicant will be required, as a condition precedent to the issue of a grant, to deposit with the Commissioner of Lands, acceptable securities or a bond from a bank or other financial institution acceptable to the Commissioner, to the value of 10 per cent of the proposed capital expenditure. In the event of acceptable securities being deposited, these shall only be released to the applicant in three instalments and against the production to the Commissioner, of Architects' Certificates in the manner following, namely—

(i) one-third when the construction of the building has reached first floor level;

(ii) one-third when the building has been roofed in, and

(iii) the remainder on completion to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands.

In the event of the applicant failing to produce any or all of such certificates as aforesaid, the said deposit or the balance thereof, as the case may be, shall be forfeited to the Commissioner of Lands.

5. The successful applicant will be required to pay within 28 days of notification that his application has been successful the stand premium set out in the Schedule, together with the proportionate amount of rent due to 31st December following, the survey fees and fees payable in respect of the preparation

and registration of the title, together with the stamp duty and the proportionate cost as so far estimated of roads, drains and sewers serving or adjoining the plot. Title will be issued as soon as possible.

6. The grant will be made under the Crown Lands Ordinance (Cap. 155 of the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Ordinance. The term of the grant will be 99 years from the first of the month following the notification that the application has been successful.

Special Conditions

1. The grantee shall erect complete for occupation within 36 months of the commencement of the term buildings of approved design on proper foundations constructed of stone, burnt brick or concrete with roofing of tiles or other permanent materials approved by the Commissioner.

2. The grantee shall maintain the buildings (including the external paintwork) in good and substantial tenable repair and condition.

3. The buildings shall not be erected until plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for disposing of sewage, surface and sullage water on the land), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been approved in writing by the Local Authority and the Commissioner. Such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications shall be submitted in triplicate to the Commissioner through the Local Authority within nine months of the commencement of the term.

4. The land and buildings shall only be used for hotel purposes.

5. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

6. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Governor; no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 1 has been performed.

7. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

8. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

9. Should the Commissioner at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

10. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the Governor in lieu thereof.

11. The Governor or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

12. No covenant condition or requirement will be entered into, imposed or made whereby the ownership or occupation of the land or any part thereof is restricted to persons of a particular race or races, or class or classes of race, or whereby such persons are excluded from such ownership or occupation.

THE Civil Service Examination (formerly known as the Civil Service Competitive Entrance Examination), will be held on 21st April, 1960. NEW CURRENCY NOTES

WITH reference to the announcement made on 16th June, 1958, regarding the issue of currency notes of a new design, it is now announced by the East African Currency Board that the new Sh. 5 note will be issued on 15th March, 1960.

Description of New Sh. 5 Note

Size.—5½ inches by 2½ inches.

Colours.—The main colour of the note, back and front, is brown, and the background tint colours are:—

Front: Dark pink and pink.

Back: green and red.

Design.—Front: The main features include a portrait of Her Majesty the Queen which appears in an oval frame at the top left-hand side of the note. English figures showing the denomination appear in the top right-hand corner and bottom left corner. The value in Gujarati appears in the top left and Arabic in the bottom right corner. The words "Five Shillings" appear in the centre of the note in English, Gujarati and Arabic. The paper contains a watermark of a lion's head in a lower central position and a security line thread in the right-hand side of the note.

Back: The value of the note in figures is drawn in each corner, and in English words in the centre. The remaining elements of the design consist chiefly of geometric security patterns into which have been incorporated panels illustrating cotton in the top centre and cloves at either side.

Instructions for Exchange of Notes

The old notes of Sh. 5 can be exchanged for notes of the new issue as under:—

Persons with banking accounts: through their bankers.

Persons without banking accounts: at any branch of the National and Grindlays Bank Ltd., Standard Bank of South Africa Ltd., and Barclays Bank D.C.O.

The new notes are on display at all district commissioners' offices, banks and post offices.

It is the hope of the Currency Board that holders of the old notes will avail themselves of the opportunity to exchange their notes for new ones so as to make the new issue a success.

The issue of these notes does not affect the legal status of the old notes, but as and when the old notes are received by the banks or currency centres they will not be re-issued.

REPORT OF THE CONTROLLER AND AUDITOR-GENERAL ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE EUROPEAN HOSPITAL TREATMENT RELIEF FUND FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 1958

The annual statement of account has been prepared to show Receipts and Payments as required by the amendment to Section 16 of the Hospital Treatment Relief (European) Ordinance, 1951, contained in Section 6 of the Hospital Treatment Relief (European) (Amendment and Validation) Ordinance, 1959, which came into effect from 1st January, 1958.

2. With reference to paragraph 4 of my Report dated 29th May, 1957, on the Accounts for the year 1956, and paragraph 3 of my Report dated 15th August, 1958, on the Accounts for the year, 1957, no adjustments have yet been made in connexion with the contributions received from the Kenya Government which were incorrectly calculated in respect of the collections made under Section 12 (2) of the former Hospital Services (European) Ordinance, Chapter 126.

3. Due to a misunderstanding claims for reimbursement in respect of Government patients were made on the European Hospital Fund Authority by the European Hospital, Kisumu, at the rate of Sh. 50 instead of Sh. 45 during the period October to December, 1958, resulting in an overpayment of £96-5s. I am informed that the overpayment is being deducted from claims for the current year.

4. I have seen Schedules of Default amounting to £3,375-17s.-75 cts. in respect of contributions payable to the Fund by the Commissioner of Income Tax which relate to the period up to 30th June, 1958. These amounts have been written off by the European Hospital Fund Authority under the provisions of Section 8 (d) of the Hospital Treatment Relief (European) Ordinance, 1951.

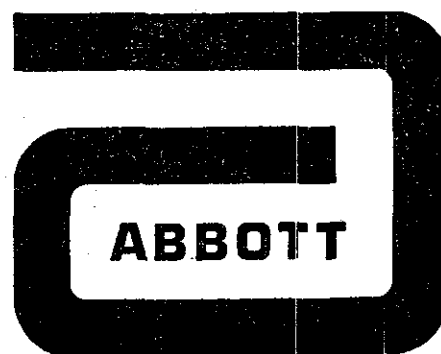
