THE WATER ORDINANCE, 1951

(No 56 of 1951)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 153 of the Water Ordinance, 1951, the Permanent Secretary for Works, as water undertaker* responsible for the provision of an adequate supply of water within an area lying between Elburgon Township and the Molo River with the approval of the Minister for Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Water Resources hereby makes the following Regulations —

THE WATER (ELBURGON PIPELINE SCHEME) REGULATIONS, 1960

1 These Regulations may be cited as the Water (Elburgon Pipeline Scheme) Regulations, 1960

2 In these Regulations, "water undertaker" means the Permanent Secretary for Works who is the water undertaker responsible for the provision of an adequate supply of water within an area lying between Elburgon Township and the Molo River

3 (1) The water undertaker, upon application being made in the form in the Schedule to these Regulations and approved, and on prior payment of the estimated cost of the connexion, shall provide and lay a communication pipe with the necessary fittings from the main to such point on the premises of the applicant as is agreed between the water undertaker and the applicant

(2) If the actual cost of the works is greater than the estimated cost the consumer shall pay the difference, while if the actual cost is less than the estimated cost the water undertaker shall credit the account of the consumer with the difference

(3) Where at the date of the application the necessary communication pipe and fittings already form part of the water undertaking and have been provided by and are the property of the water undertaker, the applicant shall not be required to make payment therefor

(4) The communication pipe so laid shall be the property of, and shall be maintained free of charge by the water undertaker. Control of supplies shall be by orifice and plug-cock, and no meter shall be fitted permanently on the communication pipe

4 Service piping from the agreed point where the communication pipe ends to some other point on the premises shall be of a size and type approved by the water undertaker

5 Applications for the execution of works shall, so far as practicable, be dealt with according to the date of their receipt, but the water undertaker may nevertheless execute the work in the manner and at the time best suited to his convenience

6 Water may be used only by persons habitually occupying the consumer's premises or for the purposes of the consumer's trade or occupation, and may not be conveyed by any means whatever for use outside the premises nor resold (whether on or off the premises) unless permission has been given by the water undertaker

7 The consumer shall be responsible for maintaining in good and efficient repair to the satisfaction of the water undertaker all service pipes and fittings and all works connected therewith

8 The water undertaker shall not be responsible for any loss or damage suffered resulting from the service pipe or other works of the consumer being out of repair or from any other cause connected with such service pipe or other works

9 No connexion shall be made to the communication pipe or any service pipe without the approval of, nor otherwise than in the manner approved by, the water undertaker

10 (1) The water undertaker shall have the right to inspect the communication pipe and service pipes and all works connected therewith, but such inspection shall be made, unless there is good reason to the contrary, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 4 p.m.

(2) The consumer shall forthwith, on being required in writing to do so, repair any service pipe or work connected therewith

11 (1) A consumer who is vacating premises shall give at least 14 days notice by registered post to the water undertaker so that the water supply to those premises may be cut off when the consumer leaves

(2) A consumer who does not give such notice shall be charged up till the end of 14 days after such time as the water undertaker is given such notice

12 The consumer shall obtain the written permission of the water undertaker before he uses water or permits water to be used for any purpose other than domestic and general agricultural purposes pertaining to the persons habitually occupying the premises

13 (1) Every consumer shall pay for water supplied according to the volume of water specified by him in his application as being his daily requirement, or such other volume as shall be agreed between the consumer and the water undertaker (hereinafter called the agreed daily requirement), whether such volume is actually used or not

(2) The flow of water from the communication pipe into the service pipes of the consumer shall be measured initially by a 24-hour meter test to the satisfaction of the consumer and the water undertaker, to ensure that the agreed daily requirement is capable of delivery through the same

(3) If at any time hereafter doubt arises as to the quantity of water supplied, the water undertaker shall at the request of the consumer and on payment of a fee of Sh 30, install a check meter for such period as is necessary to resolve the doubt to the satisfaction of both parties concerned

(4) The fee of Sh 30 shall be refunded if the water supply is found to be less than the full agreed daily requirement by more than 5 per cent

(5) Water used in excess of the agreed amount without the authority of the water undertaker or for purposes other than those authorized by the water undertaker shall, without prejudice to the rights of the water undertaker under these Regulations, be chargeable at double the standard rate, and the volume thereof shall be assessed by the water undertaker

(6) No person other than the water undertaker shall adjust or interfere with any valve or orifice

14 (1) Unless the water undertaker otherwise agrees, if premises are subdivided the amount of the water allocated to those premises shall be divided between the subdivisions after application made and approved

(2) The additional cost of providing water services for a subdivision shall be the responsibility of the person subdividing

15 A special minimum charge may be imposed or a special agreement may be entered into where a consumer cannot be supplied from an existing pipe in order to ensure a minimum economic return from a new pipe which has to be installed

16 (1) A deposit may be required which shall be retained by the water undertaker for the period covered by a consumer's agreement as a security for the payment of accounts by a consumer

(2) The deposit shall not exceed the cost of water for a normal quarter, as assessed by the water undertaker

17 All charges shall be paid by the consumer on demand

18 Any alteration in the charges shall be notified by public advertisement and also with the account rendered preceding the alteration

19 The following charges shall be paid, in addition to those payable under regulation 13 of these Regulations —

(1) A charge at the rate of Sh 2/10 per thousand gallons for the full agreed daily requirement, with a minimum charge for supply from each connexion of Sh 80 per quarter, payable quarterly in advance

(2) A charge of Sh 4/20 per thousand gallons for water used without authority under paragraph (5) of regulation 13 of these Regulations, payable on demand

(3) Sh 50 for cutting off the supply, payable on such cutting off, for any breach of these Regulations by the consumer

(4) Sh 50 for reconnecting the supply after it has been cut off, payable in advance, except in the case of a first connexion or a new consumer

20 In the event of water being in short supply, causing a shortfall on the agreed allocation of 25 per cent or more for a continuous period in excess of one month, a refund at the rate of Sh 2/10 per thousand gallons for the total shortfall shall be made in the account for the following quarter

21 The water undertaker shall be entitled, forthwith and without notice to terminate the Agreement for any breach by the consumer of these Regulations
