### JOINT INDUSTRIAL COUNCIL FOR MANUAL AND INDUSTRIAL STAFF IN THE KENYA CIVIL SERVICE

IT is notified for general information that the Governor has appointed a Council to be known as The Joint Industrial Council for Manual and Industrial Staff in the Kenya Civil Service (hereinafter referred to as The Council) with the following rules and constitution —

#### 1 Objects

- (a) To secure by means of regular joint discussion between the representatives of the Government and the Kenya Civil Servants Union the fullest measure of co-operation and joint action in the settlement of questions relating solely to manual and industrial employees of the Kenya Government
- (b) To give such employees a wider interest in and a greater responsibility for the conditions under which their work is performed
- (c) To provide machinery for dealing with grievances

#### 2 Functions

The functions of the Council shall include—

- e g remuneration superannuation leave, housing, medical benefits, promotion etc The discussion of promotion shall be restricted to the general aspects of the matter and the principles upon which promotion should rest In no circumstances shall individual cases be taken into consideration
- (b) the provision of the best means for utilizing the ideas and experience of the employees concerned
- (c) the determination of the general principles underlying disciplinary action but in no circumstances shall individual cases be considered
- (d) the promotion and encouragement of educational, in-service and other training facilities in relation to duties performed

#### 3 Composition

- (a) The Council shall consist of 24 members (including two Secretaries), to be appointed as to one half by the Government (the Official Side) and as to the other half by the Kenya Civil Servants Union (the Staff Side)
- (b) The members of both the Official and Staff Sides shall be serving civil servants save as provided in subclause (f) below
- (c) It shall be open to the authorities nominating the respective sides of the Council to vary their representatives
- (d) The Chairman of the Official Side shall be Chairman of the Council The Chairman of the Staff Side shall be Vice chairman of the Council
- (e) Each side shall appoint one of its members to act as Secretary
- f) The General Secretary of the Kenya Civil Servants' Union when not a serving civil servant shall at the request of the Staff Side and with the agreement of the Chairman of the Council be regarded as an ordinary member of Council

#### 4 Quorum

The quorum shall be five members on each side of the Council

#### 5 Meetings

The Council shall normally meet once in each quarter and at such other times as may be decided by the Chairman and Vice-chairman

#### 6 Committees

The Council may appoint standing or subcommittees as required and may delegate special powers to any committee so appointed Members of standing or subcommittees must be members of the Council, but such committees may be empowered by the Council to co-opt persons other than members of the Council whose expert knowledge of a particular subject may assist in the deliberations. Any person so co opted shall serve only in an advisory or consultative capacity

### 7 Procedure

- (a) An agenda to be agreed and signed by the Secretaries of both sides, shall be circulated to all members of the Council by the Secretary of the Official Side not less than 14 days before a meeting of the Council
- (b) Business not on the agenda shall only be taken by per mission of the Chairman and Vice chairman
- (c) Each side must supply to the Secretary of the Official Side sufficient copies of all memoranda and documents for inclusion in the agenda to permit of circulation to all members of the Council plus two for record purposes
- (d) The Council and all Committees shall keep minutes of all proceedings Such minutes shall be circulated to all members of the Council
- (e) All agenda and minutes shall be classified as not for publication

#### 8 Decisions

The decisions of the Council shall be arrived at by agreement between the two sides, shall be reported to the Government and shall thereupon become operative

#### 9 Dispute Procedure

In the event of deadlock being reached on any question before the Council, either side, or the Council jointly, shall have the right to refer the matter to the Labour Commissioner in terms of the Trade Disputes (Arbitration and Inquiry) Ordinance, Cap 118 or the Essential Services (Arbitration) Ordinance, No 4 of 1950, whichever is appropriate

#### 10 Publication of Proceedings

Only statements issued under the authority of the Council shall be published, and such statements shall be as full and informative as possible

#### 11 Amendment of the Rules and Constitution

The rules and constitution may be amended only at a meeting of the full Council Notice of amendment must be circulated to all members of the Council at least one month before the meeting
