CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE GRANTING OF SUBSIDIES FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF STORAGE DAMS

IT IS hereby notified for general information that the Government has agreed that the terms and conditions set out in Gazette Notice 2489/59 to govern the grant of subsidies for dam construction shall, with effect from Monday, 1st August 1960, be amended as follows —

(a) By substituting for condition 3 a new condition as follows

“3 Each application for subsidy shall be in respect of one dam only and shall be accompanied by a fee of Sh 100 (which is not returnable) to cover, in part, the cost of the technical examination of the application except in the case of a group application by one applicant under condition 3A’

(b) By inserting next after condition 3 a new condition as follows

‘3A Where an individual applicant wishes to construct more than one dam in the same river water course or depression, and the works are to be undertaken as one continuous operation, then all of the dams in the group are to be detailed on the application for subsidy and only one fee will be payable. The term ‘individual applicant’ in this context will include a co-operative society wishing to construct dams paid for out of its own financial resources but will *not* include a co-operative society acting as representative of a group of farmers who will pay for the dams themselves

A single group application may be submitted by a group of farmers, African farmers, co operative societies, or local authorities, or by the authorized representative of such a group, for a scheme involving the construction of a group of dams in the same river, water-course or depression where at least one dam of the group is to be situated either wholly or partially on the holding of each party to the application. In the case of a group application, whether submitted by the group or by its authorized representative, the stipulated fee shall be payable in respect of each party to the application

Where a group application has been made the provisions of clauses 4 to 18 of these conditions inclusive will be deemed to apply to a group of dams wherever dam is mentioned

Group applications are designed expressly to encourage the development of holdings where for hydrological or other good reasons a system of dams which are individually too small to merit subsidy payments is to be preferred to one or more large dams. For this reason no group application will be considered where the assessed cost of more than one dam in the group exceeds £160 in low rainfall areas or £200 in high rainfall areas

(c) By substituting for the last paragraph of condition 11 a new paragraph as follows

“The two zones of probable annual rainfall are delineated by the 30 isohyet on the ‘Mean Annual Rainfall Map of East Africa’. Copies of this map are deposited with each Divisional Hydraulic Engineer and Water Bailiff and no appeal against this zoning will be entertained’

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the above notice but is intended to indicate its effect)

The above notice promulgates in substance two amendments to the conditions set out in Gazette Notice 2489/59 to govern the grant in all cases of subsidies for dam construction. These amendments are —

(a) The adoption of a more accurate line of demarcation between high and low rainfall areas by using the 30 isohyet as the division between the low rainfall zone where the probable annual rainfall is less than 30" a year and the high rainfall zone where the probable annual rainfall is more than 30"

(b) The extension of the dam subsidy scheme to provide for the payment of subsidies for a group of small dams which cost in total not less than £160 in the low rainfall zones and £200 in the high rainfall zones, provided that no subsidy shall be payable in respect of a group which includes more than one dam the assessed cost of which exceeds the specified amounts of £160 and £200 respectively. Applications for subsidies for groups of small dams may be made by one applicant on his own behalf or one co-operative society on its own behalf (in which cases only one fee as laid down in Condition 3 is payable) or by the authorized representatives of a group or by a group acting jointly, in the latter two instances each member of the group will be required to pay the stipulated fee of Sh 100 in accordance with Condition 3A
