If IS notified for general information that as the total amount of Suez Canal surcharge already paid is now approaching the sum which it appears reasonable that the United Kingdom should pay, it has been decided that the present arrangement under which the 3 per cent suicharge is paid by the ship owners or charterers and reimbursed by Her Majesty's Government shall cease with effect from 6th August, 1960 Any payment of surcharge which may be due in respect of transits which begin after 6th August, 1960, will be made directly to the United Nations by Her Majesty's Government, and ship owners and charterers will consequently not be reimbursed any surcharges made in respect of such transits

Ship owners and charterers should however, continue to notify the Ministry of Transport of transits by ships in respect of which they would, under present arrangements, have been able to claim reimbursement and the amount of the Suez Canal tolls paid for each of these transits
