UNITED KINGDOM AWARDS FOR 1961

THE Commonwealth Scholarship Commission in London invites applications from Kenya for Commonwealth Scholarships to be held in the United Kingdom from October, 1961.

Eligibility

The United Kingdom Scholarships are primarily intended for Commonwealth citizens or British protected persons who by the time of receiving awards in 1961 are or will be graduates of a recognized University or College or holders of an equivalent qualification.

However, where no local University or College offers courses in the subjects of their choice, students without a degree may apply to take a first course of study in a United Kingdom University. Each award will be continued for the period of the programme of study or research for which it is granted, provided that the scholar's progress and conduct are satisfactory.

Value of Awards

Each scholarship is intended to cover expenses of travel, living and study during its tenure, and covers all tuition fees, a personal allowance at the rate of £51 10s. per month, a grant of £25 per year for books and apparatus and second class return sea fare to the United Kingdom.

Information about United Kingdom Universities and technical institutions may be obtained from the Higher Education Section of the Ministry of Education, Room 23, Gill House, Nairobi.

Selection

The Central Bursaries Selection Board in Kenya has been invited to make the preliminary selection of candidates and to forward their recommendations to the Secretary of the Commonwealth Commission in the United Kingdom, who will make the final decision.

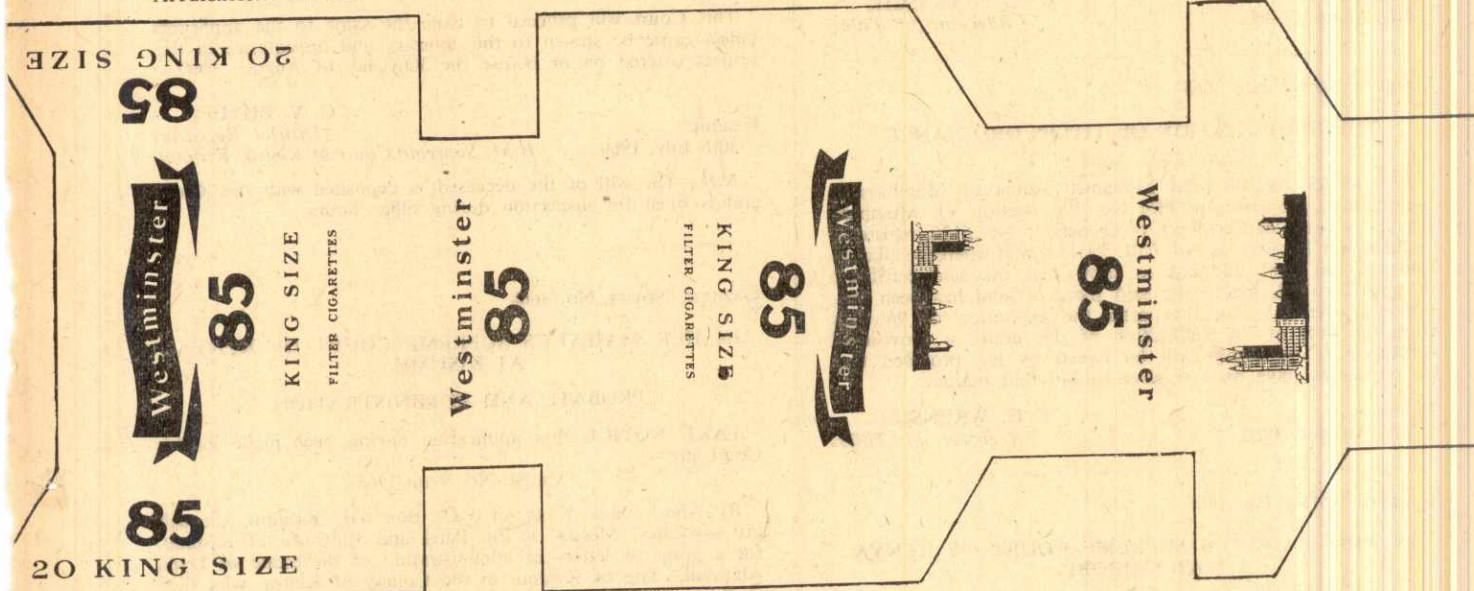
