A candidate appointed on contract will qualify for a gratuity calculated at the rate of 13½ per cent of the total salary drawn during his engagement on satisfactory completion of the contract.

COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIP AND FELLOWSHIP PLAN

INDIAN AWARDS FOR 1961

THE Government of India invites applications from Kenya for Commonwealth Scholarships to be held in India from July, 1961.

Eligibility—These scholarships are intended for men and women of high intellectual promise from other parts of the Commonwealth who may be expected to make a significant contribution to life in their own countries on their return from studies in India. They are primarily meant for post-graduate study and research in any of the Universities in India in any specific field.

The candidates must be citizens of a Commonwealth country and normally resident in Kenya. They should be graduates or holders of an equivalent qualification. An award may also be made to a graduate who wishes to study for another undergraduate degree or may be made to an undergraduate if the programme of studies he wishes to follow in India is not available in his own country.

Applicants should not have reached their 35th birthday by 1st October 1961.

Tenure of Awards—Awards will normally be made for a period of two academic years although, if circumstances require, the period may be extended or abbreviated.

Each award will be made on the understanding that it will be continued for the period of the programme of study or research for which it is granted provided that the scholar's progress and conduct are satisfactory.

Value of Awards—Each Scholarship/Fellowship is intended to cover the expenses of travel, living and study during its tenure and will be as follows—

- (a) Transportation to India and return, normally by second class rail cum sea passage or tourist air passage in the case of Fellows as arranged by the Indian Authorities
- (b) Approved tuition and other university fees (excluding board and residence)
- (c) A personal maintenance allowance at the rate of Rs 250 per month for scholars and Rs 450 per month for Fellows
- (d) A grant for books or equipment subject to a maximum of Rs 300 per annum
- (e) Approved medical expenses
- (f) A grant for expenses of approved study tours within India and for attending approved holiday or youth welfare camps, at prescribed rates

General Information—Information about Indian Universities may be obtained from the Higher Education Section of the Ministry of Education, Room 26, Gill House.

Selection—The Central Bursaries Selection Board in Kenya has been invited to make the preliminary selection of candidates and to forward their recommendations to the Deputy Secretary, Ministry of Education in India, who will make the final decision.
