1. The examination in English and Arithmetic will be held on Thursday, 27th April, 1961, at centres to be arranged in Nairobi, Mombasa, Nakuru, Nyeri and Kisumu only. The examination in Typewriting will be held departmentally on 21st April, 1961, and papers, material and instructions for the conduct of this examination will be supplied to the head of the department in which the candidate is serving.

2. Entries from candidates in the following non-Government offices only will be accepted on payment of a fee of Sh. 5, which must accompany the entry forms:—

3. NANYUKI—QUARRY LICENCES

THE Acting Commissioner of Lands gives notice that tenders for quarrying rights are invited in respect of the unsurveyed plot of an area of approximately 2.006 acres west of the Liki River in Nanyuki Township.

2. A plan showing the site may be seen at the office of the District Commissioner, Nanyuki, and the Department of Lands, City Square, Nairobi.

(a) Conditions of Tender

1. Sealed tenders marked "Tender for Quarry" together with a sum of Sh. 1,000 must be deposited with the District Commissioner, Nanyuki, before noon on 28-2-1961. Should any tenders not be accepted the Sh. 1,000 will be refunded to the unsuccessful tenderers.

2. Tenders should be accompanied by a statement indicating—

(a) an annual rent tendered for the area. There will be no Royalty payable upon stone, chips or murram quarried and disposed of;

3. The successful tenderer will be required to pay the rent due to 31st December, 1961, within seven days of the notification that their tenders have been accepted, and thereafter the rent reserved on the 1st day of January in each succeeding year.

4. The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

(b) General Conditions of Licence

1. The land shall be used for the purpose of quarrying stone only save as is hereinafter provided.

2. The land shall not be quarried within 100 feet of any road or road reserve.

3. Quarrying will commence on the lower part of the plot, provided that this is not within 100 feet of any road or road reserve.

4. No excavation will be effected below the level of the commencing point.

5. The floor of the quarry will have a slight upward grade towards the working face, and will be so drained as to be clean and free from mosquito-breeding areas to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health and the Commissioner of Lands.

6. Spoil will be used (a) to level the quarry floor after quarrying; (b) to fill excavations on the plot outside the actual quarry, as directed by the Commissioner of Lands or such officer as he may appoint to act on his behalf. No spoil will be removed from the site.

7. At all times the licensees will comply with the requests of the Commissioner of Lands, or such officer as he may appoint to act on his behalf, in respect of the proper conduct of quarrying operations.

8. Housing for Africans employed on the site may be erected on the plot in accordance with the requirements of the Labour Officer.

9. Proper sanitary arrangements will be provided in accordance with the requirements of the Medical Officer of Health.

10. The licensees shall ensure that the labour employed shall at all times be under the supervision of a responsible person while on the site.

11. The sides of the quarry will be left vertical or sloped outwards to the quarry floor to prevent any subsequent fall of earth or stone.

12. The licensees will maintain the road leading to the quarry.

13. The licensees will mark out the boundaries of the plot with posts at 50-foot intervals.

14. In the event of the above conditions not being complied with, the Commissioner of Lands shall have power to cancel the licences at 30 days' notice and any moneys paid by the licensees shall be forfeited.

15. In the event of the rent remaining unpaid for a period of 30 days after becoming due, the Commissioner of Lands may, after 30 days' previous notice in writing to the licensees eject the licensees from the plot and declare the licences to have been forfeited without, however, releasing the licensees from their liability for the payment of any sums then remaining unpaid.

16. The licensees shall pay the costs of the preparation and issue of the licence.
