THE MARKETING OF AFRICAN PRODUCE ORDINANCE

(Cap 184)
Exclusive Trading Licence

WHEREAS the Minister for Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Water Resources in exercise of the power conferred by section 3 of the Ordinance and transferred* to him under section 2 of the Transfer and Delegation of Powers Ordinance, 1955, br Order in Legal Notice No 223 of 1960 declared certain areas to be areas in which the purchase and sale of tobacco leaf shall be controlled and regulated

And whereas the Legislative Council signified by Resolution on the 20th day of July 1960 its approval to the surrender by the East African Tobacco Company Limited of the exclusive trading licence granted to it on the 29th day of August 1958 by the Governor in Council of Ministers, under the provisions of section 5 of the Marketing of African Produce Ordinance, and the grant in its place of an exclusive trading lifence for a period of seven years for the purchase of tobacco leaf in the following areas—

- (a) Those portions of Embu Fort Hall and Nyeri Districts within a radius of 15 miles from Sagana Railway Station
- (b) That portion of the Kitui District within a radius of 10 miles from Kitui Township
- (c) That portion of Embu District within a radius of 10 miles of the East African Tobacco Company's factory at Ena River

Now be it known that the Governor in Council in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 6 of the Marketing of African Produce Ordinance (Cap 184) hereby grants to the East African Tobacco Company Limited (hereina ter known as the licensee) an exclusive trading licence for a period of seven years from the date of issue of this licence in respect of the purchase of tobacco leaf within the said diclared areas subject to each and every of the following conditions—

The licensee shall during the period of this licence and any renewal thereof—

- (1) employ such European staff as shall in the opinion of the Director of Agriculture be adequate to carry out efficiently the conditions hereinafter mentioned,
- (2) furnish free of charge to native growers of the types of tobacco selected by the licensee within the areas hereinbefore mentioned, sound seed or seedlings for the growing of the leaf
- (3) advise free of charge, all such native growers in the selection and preparation of soil for the purpose of growing tobacco leaf in the transplanting, cultivation and harvesting of the crop, and generally in assisting such native growers to cultivate the crop to a successful maturity,
- (4) provide to the satisfaction of the Director of Agriculture a sufficient number of flue-curing barns to deal with all the tobacco leaf produced by such native growers. Such barns shall be so situated as to ensure to the satisfaction of the Director of Agriculture that no grower shall be required in order to sell his tobacco leaf to transport his tobacco leaf to an unreasonable distance.
- (5) purchase from all native growers all tobacco leaf grown and harvested by such native growers under the direction of the licensee in the areas hereinbefore mentioned

Provided that the licensee may refuse to purchase tobacco leaf from any native grower who has—

- (a) planted and grown any tobacco on his holding from seed or seedlings other than seed or seedlings issued to him by the licensee or by the Agricultural Department of the Government of the Colony,
- (b) collected seed from any tobacco grown on his holding,
- (6) pay for all tobacco leaf purchased by the licensee from all native producers in the area hereinbefore mentioned such prices as may from time to time be fixed by the Director of Agriculture after consultation with the licensee

Provided that in the event of the licensee and the Director of Agriculture being unable to agree upon the price to be paid to the native producer, the matter shall be referred to the Governor, whose decision shall be final

Provided further that inferior leaf which in the opinion of the licensee and the Agricultural Officer in the areas concerned i unsuitable for the purpose of flue-curing, and fire-cured leaf which is unsuitable for the purpose of manufacture shall not fall within the terms of the licence,

(7) develop the said declared areas to the satisfaction of the Director of Agriculture

This licence is issued without payment of any fee

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of Her Majesty to re enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of Her Majesty, the Governor or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he is unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within eighteen (18) months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

- 5 The land and buildings shall only be used for the following purposes—
 - (1) motor showrooms, a petrol service station, offices and flats, or
 - (11) motor showrooms, offices and flats
- 6 In the event of the land being used for the purposes mentioned at 5 (1) above the grantee shall comply with the provisions of the Petroleum Ordinance (Cap 304) and any amendment thereto or reenactment thereof for the time being in force and the rules made from time to time thereunder
- 7 The percentage of coverage on all floors shall conform with the Nairobi City Council's requirements
- 8 The grantee shall complete the erection of the first three floors of the building within 36 months of the commencement of the term, the total superficial floor area taken at each and every floor of the building shall not exceed 45 times the area of the land
- 9 The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive
 - 10 The grantee shall not subdivide the land
- 11 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Governor no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed

Provided that such consent shall not be required for the letting of individual showrooms, offices and flats

- 12 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on aemand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid
- 13 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess
- 14 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess
- 15 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, in cluding any contribution or other sum paid by the Governor in heu thereof
- 16 The Governor or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains
- 17 No convenant, condition or requirement will be entered into, imposed or made whereby the ownership or occupation of the land or any part thereof is restricted to persons of a particular race or races or class or classes of race, or whereby such persons are excluded from such ownership or occupation
