## COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIP AND FELLOWSHIP PLAN

## AUSTRALIAN AWARDS—1962

UNDER the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan the Australian Government is offering scholarships to men and women students from other parts of the Commonwealth. These scholarships will be mainly for post-graduate study and will be available in institutions of higher learning in Australia from the beginning of the academic year in March, 1962.

Scholarships will in general be tenable for a programme of study or research normally extending over a period of two academic years leading to a university degree or similar qualification.

*Eligibility.*—Applicants must normally be Commonwealth citizens or British-protected persons resident in countries of the Commonwealth other than Australia. Applications will not be considered unless they are made through the appropriate agency in the country of a candidate's normal residence, in this case the Ministry of Education, P.O. Box 30040, Nairobi.

*Age limits.*—Applicants should be under 28 years of age on 1st March, 1962, but in special circumstances this age limit may be raised.

*Benefits.*—The following benefits apply to both types of scholarship:—

(a) *Travel to and from Australia* generally by tourist air.

(b) *Fees*—all compulsory fees.

(c) *Living allowances*—paid fortnightly at the rate of £A800 per annum for post-graduate scholars and £A640 per annum for undergraduate scholars from date of arrival in Australia. In special circumstances an undergraduate scholar may receive an allowance at a higher rate. A special supplementary allowance may be paid when an award holder is travelling in Australia in connexion with his course.

(d) *Clothing allowance*—up to a maximum of £A50 in approved cases.

(e) *Married scholars*—for male married scholars undertaking post-graduate study accompanied by their wives a marriage allowance at the rate of £A200 per annum in approved cases. This will not be payable in respect of a wife who holds a scholarship herself or who is in paid employment, and will not be payable during the first year of the tenure of a scholarship unless the scholar was married at the time of his application for an award.

(f) *Travel within Australia*—up to a maximum of £A50.

(g) *Other supplementary allowances*—additional allowances may be made for unusually high costs of essential books and equipment and for extraordinary medical expenses.

## General Conditions of Award

(a) The scholar will be expected to return to his own country at the end of the scholarship.

(b) The scholar may not, without receiving special permission, take paid employment during the tenure of his scholarship.

(c) The scholar must follow the approved course of study and abide by the rules of the university or institution.

(d) Candidates for scholarships must have a good knowledge of written and spoken English.

(e) An award may be terminated at any time for reasons of unsatisfactory conduct, for breaches of the conditions of the award or for failure to make satisfactory progress.

(f) Applicants are required to be of sound health.

*Applications.*—Inquiries and requests for application forms should be made by letter to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Education, P.O. Box 30040, Nairobi, before 15th April, 1961.
