NOTICE TO NAIROBI TRADERS

THE Weights and Measures office in Ribeiro House Campos Ribeiro Avenue, Nairobi, will be open during normal office hours for the period 17th April to 28th April, 1961, for the acceptance of traders' weighing and measuring apparatus which requires reverification and stamping

All traders within a radius of 12 miles of the above-mentioned office whose apparatus was last stamped more than 12 months ago are required, under the provisions of the Weights and Measures Ordinance, 1951, to submit to the Inspector of Weights and Measures all weights measures of length and capacity and weighing instruments which they have in use for trade for verification and stamping

NEW ZEALAND AWARDS, 1962

KENYA is being offered New Zealand awards under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan for entry into courses in New Zealand in March, 1962

Eligibility—Candidates must normally be Commonwealth citizens or British protected persons resident in countries of the Commonwealth other than New Zealand. Minimum entrance qualifications to a first course in a New Zealand university include not less than two principal level subjects in Higher

Certificate or Advanced Level General Certificate of Education School Certificate credits or General Certificate of Education Ordinary Level passes must include English language

The awards will usually be for advanced study or research and will be open to students who by March will hold a degree from a recognized university, or an equivalent qualification. Applications from persons who have not reached this standard will not be considered. In exceptional cases an award may be made to a graduate who wishes to study for another undergraduate degree or may be made to an undergraduate, if the programme of studies he wishes to follow is not available in his own country

The scholarships are open to both men and women who will not have reached their thirty-fifth birthday, but preference will be given to candidates who are between 22 and 28 years of age. In special circumstances this age limit may be raised

Tenure of Awards—Awards will normally be made for a period of two academic years and the intervening summer, but when a programme of studies so requires awards may be made for a shorter or longer period

In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot
